

PERFECT CURE FOR PARALYSIS

CHICAGO EXPERT EXPECTS TO
HAVE IT IN SHAPE BEFORE
SUMMER TO PREVENT DANGER
OF ANOTHER EPIDEMIC

CHICAGO, March 7.—Dr. Maximilian Herzig expects to have perfected a cure for infantile paralysis before the fatal hot summer months, he announced today.

"Already," said Dr. Herzig, who has made an exhaustive study of the disease, prevention and cure of the disease which caused so many deaths and so much distress last summer, the microbe which causes infantile paralysis has been definitely isolated, and experiments are being made to produce an antitoxin which effectively keeps out the disease among sheep and cattle.

"We hope to have perfected an effective antitoxin for human beings by summer."

The Chicago health authorities have called prominent physicians, bacteriologists, nurses, women's clubs and civic organizations in a concerted effort to check the disease before it gets a start in Chicago this year.

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DODGE BACTERIA SAYS CORONER

PHYSICAL PREPAREDNESS IN

Retain good health or restore it. Every human being, no matter how healthy, should build fortifications for a physical personality. Very low down in the scale of animal things—at the very border line of life and death, are some minute, one-celled, white, plant-like organisms, called bacteria. There are some thirteen hundred or more species of them, everywhere present: in the air, the water, and the soil; except it be deep in the earth or in the air over the sea or high mountain top. These bacteria are microscopic in size, but they are large in number, multiplying rapidly by pinching in two. Many of them are indispensable for higher life, as for example, the putrefactive bacteria, which work over and change dead animal and vegetable life back to their former elements. Other bacteria are used for ripening cheese or making alcohol.

A few species of bacteria or "bugs," as they are popularly called, are detrimental to man. They are invisible foes. Most of them have been discovered by staining, culture growths, and the microscope, yet some are unknown, as in measles, scarlet fever and infantile paralysis. Many are found present in and on the body in health, ready to grow and multiply if your resistance is lowered. Then again, you may be invaded by a large number of them which will overcome the body forces and cause disease.

The important diseases of man caused by bacteria are: Tuberculosis, leprosy, glanders, anthrax, tetanus, malignant edema, bubonic plague, Malta fever, erysipelas, suppurative, epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis, gonorrhea, chancre, lobar pneumonia, influenza, diphtheria, typhoid fever, dysentery, Asiatic cholera, relapsing fever, actinomycosis, syphilis, chickenpox, measles, yellow fever, smallpox, German measles, mumps, whoopingcough, scarlet fever, typhus fever, rabies, rheumatic fever, dengue and other more or less rare conditions.

Lowered physiological resistance, wherein the white corpuscles of our bodies which feed on bacteria, are impoverished, allow bacteria to find a good medium on which to grow,

and thus they become, as it were, dangerous criminals and deadly enemies. Or again we may be invaded with such a large number of germs that the body forces are overcome and disease is produced. To sidestep bacteria we have germicides, disinfectants, medicines, serums, vaccines, and lastly you can build your bodies strong upon the laws of physiology and hygiene.

COUNTY DUE LARGE AMOUNT

KLAMATH COUNTY IS DUE OVER
\$40,000 FROM OREGON CALIFOR-
NIA GRANT LANDS, ACCORDING
TO REPORTS FILED

The amount due the eighteen land grant counties in Oregon on delinquent taxes from the Oregon and California land grant is \$714,775.89 according to tabulations prepared by Oswald West, who is representing the department of the interior in steps to collect the back taxes.

This amount is for back taxes, penalties, interest and costs on the grant lands for 1915, 1916 and 1917. Interest on the amount totals \$15,000 a month. In addition to the eighteen Oregon counties there is one Washington county, Clarke, that has grant lands. The amount due Clark county is \$1,342.73, making a grand total due of \$716,118.62.

Klamath county is due the sum of \$49,040.43, according to the report.
