They ask that England apply the self government principles outlined by President Wilson in his speech before the senate recently to Ireland.

POTTERY PLANT BURNS ON BAY

LOSS OF \$200,000 SUFFERED BY STEIGER TERRA COTTA POTTERY PLANT IN SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO FROM FIRE

SAN FRANCISCO, March 8.—The Steiger Terra Cotta Pottery company plant in South San Francisco burned this morning, the company suffering an estimated damage of \$200,000, which is partially covered by insurance.

The fire is believed to be the work of incendiaries. The plant has been closed for three weeks, on account of labor trouble. The night watchman found the floor saturated with kerosene after the fire had started. Fireman Will Velt was injured by falling glass.

WOMAN WRITES NOTE AND DIES

MRS. HELEN SHAW OF SAN FRANCISCO, COMMITS SUICIDE BY ASPHYXIATION—MIND UNSETTLED BY BROODING

SAN FRANCISCO, March 8.—Writing a note to her husband that she was "battered to death and starvation by enemies of this country," Mrs. Helen Shaw, aged 62 years, committed suicide here by asphyxiation. She was strongly anti-German. It is believed that brooding unsettled her mind.

COUNTY RECORDS ARE COMMENDED BY ACCOUNTANTS

KLAMATH COUNTY'S DEFICIT IS MATERIALLY REDUCED

Work of Checking County's Books Is Completed and Report Filed With County Clerk—Number of Mistakes Not Out of Proportion to Amount of Business Handled and County Officers Commended.

Klamath county's records are in splendid shape, and the few errors are not disproportionate to the amount of business transacted in the several offices, says the report of W. S. Slough and Allen Sloan, who completed this week the work of checking and noting the errors in county books for the past year.

The report shows that the county debt has been reduced approximately from \$500,000 slightly more than two years ago to the sum of \$315,391.97 at the end of last year. The resources are, including the general fund, road fund, new court house fund and county library fund, \$54,884.21, and liabilities, including general fund warrants outstanding and interest, road house claims unpaid, \$370,376.18.

Ex-Sheriff Low's record shows that he collected fees to the amount of \$62.20. County Clerk DeLap collected fees to the amount of \$3,192.50 and Circuit Court Clerk Chaastain, fees to the amount of \$1,113.50. Personal taxes in 1916 on the 1917 roll

NICHOLS SCHOOL SITE NOT LIKED

VOTERS TURN DOWN SITE PUT UP BY BOARD BY OVERWHELMING VOTE AT YESTERDAY'S SCHOOL ELECTION

The school election held here yesterday to decide upon the choosing of the Nichols addition site to be used as a new location for a central school lost by a vote of 171 against and 75 for the site.

Little interest was shown in the election until the last day or so when a considerable number of people got out and worked against the choosing of this site for a number of reasons, including the price, the ownership of the land, the location, and some because the school board did not announce its stand for or against the site.

It is felt by many in favor of the site and others who were undecided as to how to vote, that not sufficient publicity was given the board's decision on the site as to its good or bad qualifications.
