SUPERINTENDENT BENNETT ALREADY ON GROUND TO BEGIN OPERATIONS JUST AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

ALGOMA, March 12.—The repair work on the Algoma mill is being rushed to completion, and the company intends starting the mill and logging camp as soon as the weather will permit.

There is at the present time about seventeen inches of ice on the mill pond, and unless there is a sudden change in the weather spring work is liable to be materially hindered. However, a good season is expected, and the company intends making a record run.

UNCLE SAM HUNTS SOLDIERS JOBS

HAS HAD ESTABLISHED NATION WIDE EMPLOYMENT BUREAU EVER SINCE TROOPS RETURNED FROM MEXICAN BORDER

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 12.—Uncle Sam's nation wide employment service, ever since the troops began to filter back from the border, has scoured the land, job hunting for the militiamen who quit their places to go south.

Militia organizations and their friends have assisted, the press has done its bit, and the response from the employing public, employment officials declare, has been unprecedented. Employment offices at Denver, Baltimore, Helena, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Boston, New Orleans and Chicago reported success in the job-hunting campaign. Large employers of labor as well as the private business men are reported enthusiastically co-operating in the work of providing for the jobless warriors.

As fast as the positions come into the employment offices the militia organizations in the various districts are notified, and the jobs listed with the commanding officers.

Even the women section of the employment service is lending aid in the campaign.

"There will be more jobs than there will be men to fill them," Commissioner Cammeltt of the Immigration bureau, in charge of the work, stated recently.

Chief Justice White Celebrates
WASHINGTON, D. C., March 12.—Just twenty-three years ago today Chief Justice White received his appointment to the supreme court of the United States. His appointment was a compromise on a fight over two Cleveland appointees, who were not wanted by the senate. Justice White is in excellent health and spirits, despite his long service and advanced years. He was United States senator from Louisiana when appointed.
