NEW YORK, March 22.—Senor Don Jesus Alvarado, whose ancestors for 400 years have been collecting art objects illustrative of the ancient arts of the natives of Ecuador, offered the famous collection at auction at the Anderson galleries here today. Some of the objects are practically priceless. The collection attracted much attention at the Panama-Pacific exposition. Perhaps most interesting in the group is the coat of mail of Lorenzo de Aldana, the famous Spanish soldier, given to Senor Alvarado's ancestor, Don Pedro, who started the collection in 1533. This armor alone is valued at thousands of dollars.

PROJECTS TO BE USED AS CAMPS

WESTERN IRRIGATION CANALS
DECLARED TO BE IDEALLY
SUITED FOR USE AS DETENTION
CAMPS IN CASE OF WAR

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 22.—The war department is perfecting plans with the department of the interior for the use of several big reclamation projects in the West as possible internment camps for persons to be arrested upon the outbreak of war. The reclamation projects are declared to be ideally suited.

The ones counted upon for camp use are isolated in the sagebrush deserts. They would receive a minimum of guarding because it would be practically impossible for a person to escape unaided across the miles of desert. Under the plan the several gateways of the reclamation projects would be securely guarded and all trains leaving the camps would be searched. Beyond the heavy guard at such gateways a mounted patrol would be sufficient, it is believed by officials in charge of the plans, to prevent the escape of interned persons into the open desert.
