LIN SAY THAT STATE OF WAR AGAINST U. S. EXPECTED IN FORTY-EIGHT HOURS

LONDON, March 28,-"According Chilleote, 638 Main street. to private telegrams from Berlin to the Amsterdam bourse Wednesday, it is expected that a state of war with the United States will be an accomplished fact within forty-eight hours,' says a dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph from Amsterdam.

"American journalists in Berlin," the dispatch adds, "have been warned to this effect by the foreign office."

WASHINGTON, D. C., March \$3 .-Next to war, the attention of the American government is upon one other objective-the internal situstion in Germany. With a military consorship acreening the history-mak-ing events transpiring within the Ger-man empire and equally screening from the German people the full meaning of events in the world outside, the real condition of affairs in that country, guardedly reflected in disptaches from abroad, commands close attention.
