

# Patriotic Week Is Marked in Portland

This is patriotic week. In a proclamation issued by Governor Withycombe, every citizen of Oregon is called upon to consecrate himself and herself to a display of practical patriotism and the young men are urged to join the national guard.

Moreover, Patriotic Week is suggested as a good time for a universal display of the Stars and Stripes. There is no more impressive way, it is pointed out, of showing the world that America is solidly united than to unfurl Old Glory on every flagpole, and show the colors in windows, on coat lapels and in the home.

The Third Oregon Infantry has been called to colors. None of the twelve companies has been recruited to war strength. There is immediate need of recruits. Now is the time for the men to step forward and enlist, says the proclamation.

Furthermore the United States army is short 16,000 men, and in the war which now seems to be inevitable Uncle Sam must rely upon his own forces as the first line of defense. The call for men has been made from Washington. Oregon has been requested to do her share. Patriotic Week is the opportune time for men to offer their services.

The governor's proclamation is as follows:

Whereas, Loyalty and patriotism are virtues which every true American is proud to possess and glad to express, and

Whereas, it is plainly evident that the existing military resources of our

government are totally inadequate for the proper protection of the country, and

Whereas, Our best opportunity for voluntary patriotic service is offered by the national guard, which today stands in sore need of upbuilding if it is adequately to meet the requirements which may be placed upon it, and

Whereas, I believe that a spirit of patriotism not surpassed in fervor or intensity at any time in our national history, lives in the hearts of the people of this great state of Oregon, which only awaits the call for an expression:

Now, therefore, I, James Withycombe, as governor of the state of Oregon, suggest that the need of the national guard for recruits offers practical opportunity for the display of patriotic patriotism, and I urge young men to fulfill the obligations of our national citizenship by rallying to the flag, thus setting an example worthy of our best traditions and indicative of their certain continuance:

And I further proclaim the week beginning March 25, 1917, as "Patriotic Week" for the state, to be devoted to the sober consideration of present day patriotism, and urge that all officers of the Oregon national guard make special effort to recruit their companies to full capacity by the end of that time.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the state of Oregon to be hereunto affixed this 21st day of March, 1917.

## MONEY SHOULD BE SET ASIDE FOR WATERWAYS

PRESIDENT RIVERS AND MAR-BOIS CONGRESS URGES

Not a Dollar Has Been Appropriated and It Is Up to the Special Session of Congress to Provide, Says Senator Randol—Inability of Railroads to Handle Situation During Peace Shows Facts.

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 28.—"If there ever was a time when the friends of waterways should bestir themselves, that time is now," declares Jos. E. Randol, U. S. senator from Louisiana and president of the National Rivers and Harbors congress.

"Not a dollar has yet been appropriated to continue the work on rivers and harbors during the coming fiscal year and, unless the needed funds are provided at the session of congress, practically all work of this character must shortly be stopped. In all the harbors from Eastport to Key West and Brownsville, from San Diego to Seattle, from Ogdensburg to Chicago and Duluth, and on all the rivers of the country, great and small, hundreds of dredges will be stilled, thousands of boats and barges will be tied up to the banks and tens of thousands of men will be discharged.

"Not only did the rivers and harbors bill fail, but the sundry civil bill as well. It is in the latter bill that appropriations are made for projects which have been placed under continuing contracts and to the completion of which, therefore, the honor of the government has been pledged.

"For more than a year the traffic history of the United States has been principally a record of delay, congestion, car-shortage and embargoes. I have no doubt that the losses which these delays and embargoes have caused to the merchants, manufacturers and workmen of the United States have been far greater than the total sum that would be required to improve every river and harbor in the country.

"If our railroads, efficient as they are, are utterly unable to handle the traffic in time of peace, what would happen in time of war?

"We ought to begin at once the work of creating a national system of

waterways and harbors and push that work to completion at the earliest possible time. There ought to be a rivers and harbors bill passed before the present fiscal year has closed. But, if we are to judge the future by the past, nothing is more certain than that, whenever another river and harbor bill shall be presented, it will meet with violent opposition.

"Before the extra session convenes on April 3, urge all friends of waterways to call upon their senators and representatives to support appropriations for the rivers and harbors which are essential to our national prosperity and may be vital to our national safety."

## BOMBS MADE ON INTERNEED LINERS

ONE HUNDRED FIRE BOMBS FOR FREIGHT SHIPS MADE ON HOBOKEN—TWO GERMANS SAID TO BE "GREAT CATCH" TAKEN OFF TRAIN AT CHICAGO

NEW YORK, March 28.—One hundred fire bombs to be secreted on ships carrying supplies for the entente were constructed on interned German liners including the Hoboken, according to testimony at a bomb plot case here yesterday.

It is claimed one man made 50 in twelve days, using sulphuric acid and sodium nitrate placed in separate chambers. The acid eating into nitrate would start a fire after a certain length of time.

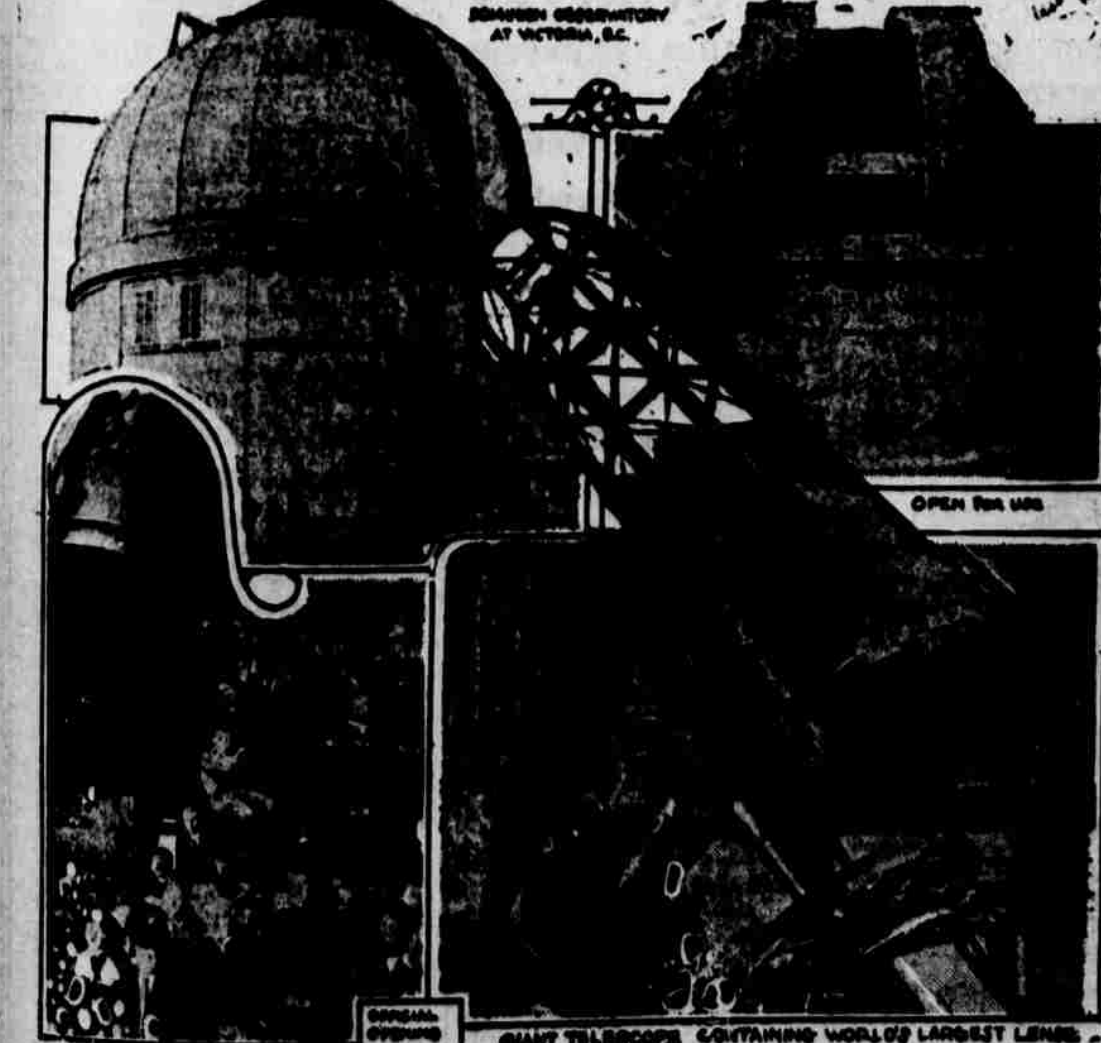

## CANADA STAR GAZERS GET WORLD'S BIGGEST TELESCOPE



It is with reflecting telescopes that many brilliant astronomical discoveries are made. Their construction, however, is not so well understood as that of the refracting telescope, the type of instrument often seen in the parks or on the streets.

The lens at the upper end of a reflecting telescope is the object glass. It collects the rays of light and brings them together at a focus to form an image, which is viewed with a magnifying eyepiece. The largest reflecting telescope in the world is the 100-inch Yerkes instrument. It has an object glass 40 inches in diameter.

The biggest reflecting telescope in the world is in Canada. This has been erected at Victoria, B. C., only a short journey from Vancouver by Canadian Pacific steamers. In a reflecting telescope, the light is collected by reflection from the surface of a concave mirror. If this surface is ground to a parabolic shape, the rays will all come together at a single point to form an image, just as with the refracting telescope. At this point, however, will be situated on the same side of the mirror as the object. Hence the observer who looks at a star will find his own head in the line of vision. In order to overcome this difficulty, a second reflection deflects the beam of light and forms the image at one side of the tube, where it may easily be examined with an eyepiece. This second reflection is accomplished by means of a plane mirror or "flat" inserted in the upper end of the tube and set at an angle of 45 degrees. This flat will necessarily cut off some of the light falling upon the principal mirror, but since it is not large and since its supports are made as slender as possible, there is no serious loss.
