NOVEL PATRIOTIC WINDOW DISPLAY

EXHIBITION OF FAC SIMILES OF MANY HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS MAY BE SEEN IN DRUGSTORE. REPRODUCTION IS EXACT

Among the many patriotic window displays to be seen in Klamath Falls at present, and one of the most striking and interesting, is that of the Underwood Pharmacy.

It consists of an exhibition of the fac similes of many historical documents. Among them are the Declaration of Independence; the Agreement of Secrecy; the Monroe Doctrine; Proclamation Disbanding the Continental Army; Washington's Inaugural Address; Treaty Ending the War of 1812; Treaty Ending the Revolutionary War; the Constitution of the United States; Grant's Letter to General Lee at Appomattox; Treaty of the Spanish-American War, and several other rare and curious documents.

These are all reproduced in the exact manner in which they were written—all the signatures of the famous men that signed them, together with the seals and ribbons of the various governments that were parties to the treaties.

These will be of interest to all students of history, as well as those merely curious. The collection is the property of E. E. Magee.

5 KLAMATH BOYS AT NAVAL SCHOOL

LETTER FROM NELSON HALL TELLS OF EXPERIENCES ON TRIP AND AT U. S. NAVAL TRAINING SCHOOL AT SAN FRANCISCO

Five Klamath Falls and Klamath county boys are at the United States naval training station at San Francisco, according to a letter received here by Mrs. Wm. Hall, whose son, Nelson, enlisted in the navy and left here April 14.

Nelson is a petty officer, and is in Company B-6, and considers himself lucky when a Klamath man on the train replenished his resources.

His letter in part is as follows: "I am sure having some time. Walter Rouse is here, and five other boys from there. I struck it lucky all around. We were on the train with R. A. Johnson, and he gave Walter Rouse and myself \$5 each.

"I was called out of bed this morning, and am now a petty officer. Gee, but this is great. Just like home; see beds and see cats.

"There are four German vessels in the harbor, and the Germans are in jail. I gave 25 cents for this paper, envelope and stamps."

SIR ERNEST IS ROYALLY FETED

SAN FRANCISCO, April 13.—Lieutenant Sir Ernest Shackleton, R. N., finds that the strenuous life of an Antarctic explorer is soft in comparison with the returned hero. When Shackleton came to San Francisco on the liner Sierra, his real troubles began. Four committees were on hand with invitations.

"You must have luncheon with our club." "You must be our guest," the would-be hosts announced in unison. Three more committees waited for him on the dock. He found piles of letters awaiting him at the hotel.

"If I attended all the banquets and luncheons I am invited to I would be eating all day," he said, referring them to his secretary. He is lecturing on his rescue trip to Ross Island, where ten members of his expedition were stranded for a year. Three of them died. It is from this rescue trip that he has just returned. In referring to American participation in the war, Shackleton predicted that it would mean earlier victory for the entente, but declared Germany never had a chance.

TWO 16-YEAR YOUTHS ENLIST

SAN FRANCISCO, April 13.—Two 16-year-old boys have responded to Uncle Sam's call, and enlisted in the navy as apprentice seamen. They are Harry Teeple of Oakland and Wm. Burdick of San Francisco.

The two walked into the recruiting station and announced they wanted to enlist. Under orders received Monday their enlistment was possible, despite their youth. Both were examined and found physically fit for service, and at noon Tuesday they raised their right hands and swore allegiance to the Stars and Stripes. Teeple, besides being the youngest is the lightest sailor in the navy, weighing only 99 pounds.
