MONTH OF MARCH A Jinx for Monarchs

NUMEROUS CROWNED HEADS OF EUROPE HAVE EITHER LOST THEIR HEADS OR THRONES DURING EVENTFUL MONTH

LONDON, April 18.—The month of March holds a persistent jinx for European royalties, as shown by a table of regal murders, dethronements and abdications following the czar's removal. Old Gustavus III, king of Sweden, got his on March 16, 1792; Alexander II of Russia on the 13th of March, 1881, and George I of Greece on March 18, 1913. All were murdered. Charles III, Duke of Parma, also went by the murder route in March, 1954. Gustavus IV of Sweden was dethroned by his affectionate uncle, the Duke of Sudermania, March 13, 1809. The abdication of Nicholas of Russia and his abdication at the same time on behalf of his son, completes the list of March upheavals which prove the monarch's life in March is not a happy one.

PERUVIAN GOVERNMENT NIPS NAVAL REVOLT IN THE BUD

LIMA, Peru, April 18.—Charges that a number of important officers were implicated in a plot for a naval revolt are under investigation by the Peruvian government today. The conspiracy is said to have been hatched in retaliation for the arrest of certain naval commanders. The ministry of marine gained an inkling of the situation and promptly dismantled the guns on the warships besides disabling the vessels' engines by removing essential parts of each which were locked up in the arsenal under heavy guard.

AMERICANS CONTROL BRAZILIAN COFFEE CROP

RIO DE JANEIRO, April 18.—The best Brazilian coffee crop is estimated at between twelve and thirteen million bags of 133 pounds each. The extraordinary feature about this crop is that about two-thirds of these bags will be bought, sold, shipped or otherwise handled for the first time by American business interests represented here in Brazil. War and American enterprise constitute the reasons. The British blacklist, the shortage of shipping for European ports, lack of financial support, and the departure of Germans to their own country to fight opened the door for Americans to take the coffee business from the Germans.

Want New Colon LONDON, April 18.—Americans here are urging their friends who make occasional trips to the United States to bring back dimes, quarters and half dollars of the new design. The new coins are still at a premium in the American colony.

WASHINGTON, April 18.—The navy's "doctor" is Rear Admiral W. C. Braisted, surgeon general and chief of the navy medical service. Before being called upon by Secretary of the Navy Daniels to head the medical service, Admiral Braisted was fleet surgeon of the Atlantic fleet. His illuminating report on the revolutionary medical and sanitary development of the Japanese army and navy during the Russo-Japanese war, started him on the road to prominence, attracting the attention of medical authorities all over the world.

MEXICAN DEPUTIES ARE REPORTED TO BE HOSTILE

SAID NIGHT FAVOR CARRANZA'S NEUTRALITY PLAN AND THAT ONE MEMBER DEMANDED THAT MEXICO ALLY WITH GERMANY

EL PASO, April 18.—Thousands of Carranzista soldiers are concentrating at Chihuahua City today and the garrison at Durango, Zacatecas, Aguascalientes and Nuevo Leon have been withdrawn. It was reported yesterday afternoon that only eight members of the Mexican chamber of deputies are in favor Carranza's neutrality plan as outlined Sunday. It is rumored there were wild scenes in the chamber yesterday, one member demanding that Mexico ally herself with Germany against America.

FEDERATED CLUBS MEET AT EUREKA, CAL.

EUREKA, Cal., April 18.—A four-day session of the San Francisco district of the Women's Federated Clubs of California opened in Eureka this morning, following the arrival here last night of scores of leading club women from all parts of northern California. The convention session this morning was called to order in the newly completed clubhouse of the Eureka Monday Club.

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FORMER CONGRESSMEN ON TRIAL IN GERMAN PLANT
NEW YORK, April 18.—Five Americans, including the two former congressmen, Buchanan and Fowler of Illinois and former Ohio Attorney General Monnett, went to trial in the Federal court here charged with conspiring to foment strikes in munitions plants in the United States to prevent the manufacture of arms to be used against Germany. They have denied their guilt. They were members of the Labor National Peace Council, a pro-German organization, and were indicted with Franz von Rintellin, German plotter.



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
