# HOUSE PASSES DRAFT BILL BY

STRAIGHT DRAFT AMENDMENT IS ADOPTED -

Record Vote to Be Taken Late Today Expected to Increase the in Favor of Measure Speaker Clark and Miss Rankin Vote Against Plan-House Cheers Wildly When Vote Is Announced.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 28 .-The bouse, acting as a committee of the whole today, passed the Kahn smendment to Dent's army bill, embodying the conscription plan of military service, by a vote of 278 to 98. Dent's bill provided that the presi-

dent first try the voolunteer system. Kahn's amendment provides for straight conscription.

Later today the house will take a vote of record on the bill, which is expected to show an increase in the majority voting for the bill.

Speaker Champ Clark and Congressman Jeannette Rankin of Montana were among those voting against the conscription bill.

The house cheered wildly when the vote was announced.

For the period from April 1 to April 24, Oregon stands second in a list of the coaches, Miss Marshall and Pro- all states in the recruiting record for the United States army, according to Postmaster W. A. Delzell of this city "Nevada leads the list, with Califor

nia in the eleventh place," said Mr. Delzell. "Oregon's quota was 1344 men to be raised. Seven hundred and ninety-eight have enlisted up to that date, or 59.3 per cent of its quota.

"Nevada's percentage was 94.4, Callfornia 21.6 and Washington 15.5. Vermont is at the foot of the list with

"Klamath county alone, with a total population of about 12,000 people, enlisted as many men for the army as the entire state of New Hampshire did and sent in a good bunch to the navy besides.

"Our total to the army and navy to gether equals all that the whole state of North Dakota sent to the army for the same period. We doubt if any county in the United States, considering our sparse population, has equaled our record, for in sparsely settled regions every man has a job at home and is needed too, while in the states having a dense population more men in proportion are available.
