MERRILL CLOSES UP FOR FUNERAL
ABOUT THIRTY KLAMATH FALLS PEOPLE ALSO ATTEND BURIAL SERVICES OF MRS. GUY MERRILL YESTERDAY

Mrs. C. G. Merrill, who died suddenly from heart trouble Sunday, was buried at the local cemetery at Merrill yesterday afternoon. Services were held at 2 o'clock at the Merrill home, and were largely attended by friends from all parts of the county, about thirty going down from Klamath Falls. The sudden death of Mrs. Merrill was a great shock to the people of Merrill and vicinity, following as it did the announcement of her rapid recovery from a recent operation. Every business house and office in Merrill was closed during the services, and two auto loads of floral offerings testified to the high esteem in which Mrs. Merrill was held by all. The stricken husband and young son have the sympathy of the entire county in their bereavement.

VACUUM CAPTAIN AMONG RESCUED

GRASS VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, BOY IS YET AMONG MISSING, AND IS BELIEVED PERISHED WHEN OIL STEAMER WAS SUBMERGED

LONDON, May 2.—The second boat of survivors from the oil steamer Vacuum, submerged last Saturday off the coast of England, has been saved, including Captain S. S. Harris of New York, captain of the ship, and four more members of the United States navy gun crew.

Captain Harris told the American consul where they landed that Lieutenant Thomas and three of the gunners are still missing.

GRASS VALLEY, Calif. May 2.—It was reported in this city that Lieutenant Clarence Thomas, son of the late J. M. Thomas, a bank cashier of Grass Valley, had been transferred with twelve men to the oil steamer Vacuum torpedoed Saturday. Relatives wired to the navy department for information, but were told it was against the rules to give out the names of officers.

Elmer Anderson came down yesterday from Chiloquin on business.

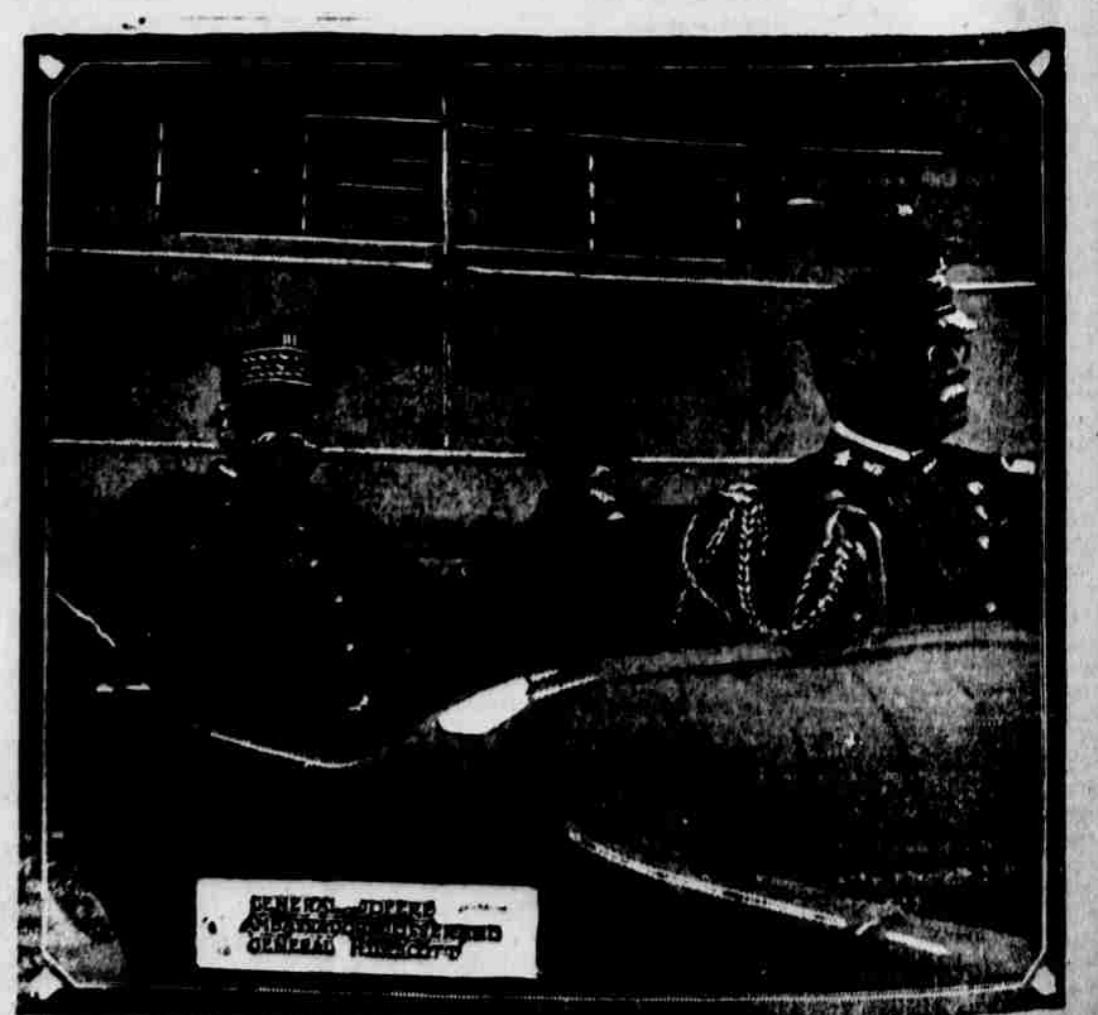
