JAPAN IS ACTIVE IN SOUTH AMERICA

WASHINGTON, May 11.—Additional competition for our new merchant marine has already established itself. Consular reports just received from Buenos Aires tell of the inauguration of a regular line of Japanese cargo steamers between Japan and Brazil and Argentina.

The Osaka Mercantile Steamship company of Tokyo projected the line, and one vessel, the Kasato Maru (6,309 tons) already is in service. The line will touch at Vladivostok, Chinese ports, Singapore, Durban and Cape Town, in addition to South Atlantic ports.

Brazilian ports are reported to have contracted for large numbers of Japanese colonists to help harvest the coffee crop.

BIG FLAG POLE IS 155 FEET FROM GROUND

The sailor spent two weeks working on the pole. A five-inch gold ball adorns the top of the staff, but it looks like a marble from the ground. Johnson is now trying to find a flag suitable for the pole.
