NEW YORK'S CASUALTY  
LIST RESEMBLES WAR

NEW YORK, May 16.—Although there is no shrapnel flying around the streets of New York, so many people are killed or hurt daily that a complete casualty list would look like an official battlefield statement, according to United hospital statistics, made public today.

They show somebody is injured in the streets every twenty-three minutes and every fourteen hours one is killed there. In the last twelve months 4,224 persons met violent deaths in New York, 1,147 were killed by falls, 765 died in street accidents and 428 burned to death.

WESTERN ROADS  
GIVE POOR SERVICE

OREGON PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSIONER THINKS CAR SHORTAGES AND OTHER SHORTAGES SHOULD BE CHARGED UP

SALEM, May 16.—Public Service Commissioner Buschelt has his own opinion of the kind of service most northwestern railroads are offering. Although these roads are now petitioning for a general 15 per cent increase in freight rates, Buschelt declared today he thought the rates should be reduced to be commensurate with the service rendered.

"The car shortage is an instance of inadequate service," he declared. "During the last two years the carriers have furnished miserable service and yet have gained enormously in wealth, while the shippers have not received a just return for the payments made."

"Besides urging that more rolling stock is needed, the carriers also advance as a reason for an increase in freight rates that the price of fuel, materials, supplies, etc., are abnormal. While this latter contention is true, it must also be borne in mind that the carriers are enjoying abnormal business, and that the operating revenues of the principal roads in Oregon have increased by millions in the last year."

PORTLAND WOMEN  
MAY RUN CARS

PUBLIC'S ATTITUDE IS THE ONLY THING KEEPING STREET CAR COMPANY FROM PUTTING THEM ON NOW

PORTLAND, May 16.—Portland may have street car women. In fact, Portland would probably have had "motor-women" and conductors recruited from the fairer sex, were it not for the fact that the officials of the company don't know how the public would take the innovation.

"The company has lost one-third of its street car men," said one official today. "The propriety of hiring women to fill the places of men gone to war has often been discussed."

"Many women drive their own automobiles. Street car motoring is no more difficult and much less dangerous. There is no question about the capability of women to do the work. It's next to impossible to find men right now to fill the vacancies, and it is but a question of time—a short time—when there must be a showdown. And I wager the women will win."

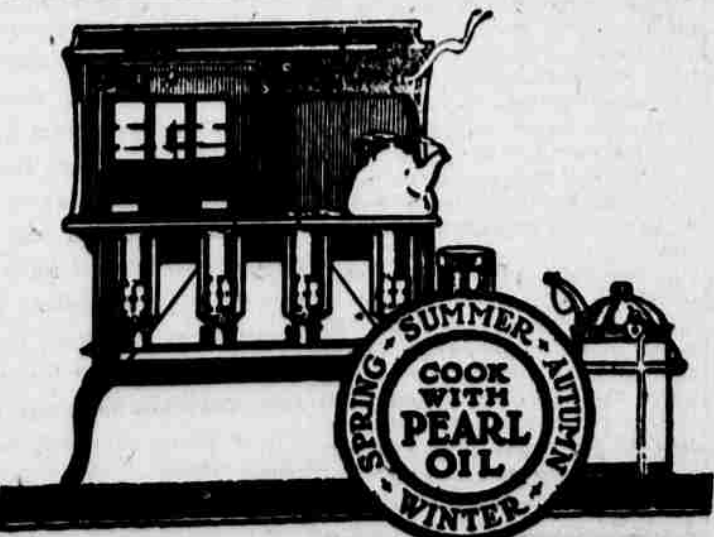
