Good Roads for Oregon

IN CONCLUSION.

I am, indeed, very sorry that our good friends who are opposing these bonds, many of whom are my personal friends, and whom I hold in high esteem, should see fit to use such misleading arguments that appeal not to the reason but to the prejudice of the people, in their attempt to defeat this road building program.

HONEYCOMBED WITH SUSPICION. Without any personal reflection of any kind, I want to say this, that Oregon today is honeycombed with suspicion and distrust. She is tied to the post with the halter of wanting confidence. We never can hope to make progress as a State until this condition is overcome. No business enterprise can succeed when the partners lack confidence and are suspicious of each other. No home can be happy where the members of that home distrust each other and no State can succeed and make progress when people lend themselves to the destruction of confidence in those who are honestly endeavoring to do something for the good of all the people.

"UNDESIRABLE CITIZENS." I want to say this, in all kindness, that that man who goes about the State pointing the finger of suspicion at others, arraying class against class, and destroying the confidence of the people is a menace to the welfare of the State. If he does such things with malicious intent, he becomes an undesirable citizen and the quicker his address bears the mark of another State, the better it will be for this grand old State of Oregon.

RAILROADS TO PLAN CURTAILMENT

MAIN LINE PASSENGER SERVICE AND OTHER PHASES TO BE THE SUBJECT OF WAR CURTAILMENT.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., May 25—Plans for the curtailment in main line passenger service and other wartime economies in railroad operations are under discussion here today at a conference of the chief operating officials of western railroads. Northwestern railroads are well represented.

It is expected that this movement of reduction, the number of trains will begin in the east and will become effective first between points served by two or more roads. On many lines, it is pointed out, there is duplication of service, such as, for example, the three night trains between Portland and Seattle on three competing lines. Curtailment in passenger service would be directed toward the elimination of such duplication.

Fewer passenger trains will release railroadmen and equipment for an augmented freight service.

KLAMATH BOY IN FOURTH SQUADRON

CLARENCE LENOX WRITES FATHER OF HIS EXPERIENCES AT VANCOUVER AND FORT SAM HOUSTON.

The following is part of a letter received by D. H. Lenox, of this city, from his son, Clarence W. Lenox, of the fourth aero squadron at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

"The three weeks we were at Vancouver they had so many men there that they could not feed them anything hardly, so we ate one meal and sometimes two out of Vancouver. Kenneth soon ran out of money and I paid for both our eats.

"We were on the train when the payroll was signed and missed our first day day, so we will have to wait another month for our pay. We're in the army now so I guess we should worry.

"All men who have not been in the service before have to have a certain amount of infantry drill so we are getting ours now. About three hours every day and that is almost all we do.

BASEBALL CHATTER

SAN FRANCISCO, May 25—There's something in the air in California that acts like the waters of Ponce de Leon's fountain of youth on the arms of veteran pitchers. At least, there are quite a few major-league old timers "getting by" in the Pacific Coast League.

Bill Burns, veteran southpaw, who has twirled for almost every club in both big leagues; Jean Dubuc, former Detroit star; Charles Hall once a dependable twirler with the Red Sox; Art Fromme, ex-New York Giant and Cincinnati Red; "Long Tom" Hughes, first string Washington twirler in the 19th Century; "Spider" Baum, who twirled for Altoona in the old Tri-State League, and Harry Krause, who was with Connie Mack in 1910, are still winning games in the major league of the far west.

Pacific Coast League fans are not surprised over Pitcher Frank Miller's success with the Pittsburgh Pirates this season. Miller is a Coast League product. The White Sox drafted him in 1912 but he was taken ill with diphtheria during the winter and had to retire for two seasons. Strong as an average man possibly can be, Miller was a wonderful pitcher in 1912. He could pitch almost every day, seldom failing to send eight or ten batters back to the water bucket. Only the other day Miller twirled the first shut-out game of the season against the New York Giants, allowing four hits and striking out seven batters.
