NAVY YARD WILL BE COMMANDERED

GOVERNMENT WILL TAKE ACTION UNLESS STRIKERS SETTLE ALL TROUBLES AND WORK ON BATTLESHIPS.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 31—Unless the strike at the Newport shipbuilding company's plant is immediately settled the government will commandeer the plant to prevent delay on the construction of two battleships under construction there.

This plant is building the ships Maryland and West Virginia and has also contracted to build four battle cruisers.

The plant observed Memorial Day yesterday as a holiday while navy officials attempted to bring about a settlement on the strike.

OREGON GETS THREE HOLIDAYS

SUNDAY, ELECTION DAY AND REGISTRATION DAY FALL IN ROW. GOVERNOR HOLDS JUNE 5 MOST IMPORTANT.

SALEM, Ore., May 31—Oregon will have three legal holidays in a row. June 3 is Sunday; June 4th, election day is a holiday, and June 5th, registration day, is also a legal holiday.

Of the three, the Governor believes the registration day the most important. "I have given this matter considerable thought, realizing that if June 5 is declared a legal holiday, it will mean 3 such holidays in succession," said the executive in discussing the proposal that he issue a proclamation designating June 5 as a holiday. "But June 5 is to be one of the most momentous days in the history of the nation. While, in a way, it might be considered the occasion for a celebration, it will be the occasion of a great and solemn event as well, and will be treated as such."

BEND-BURNS ROAD IN GOOD CONDITION

BEND, Ore., May 31—The road from Bend to Burns is now in good condition, and scores of automobiles are making the trip daily over this highway which goes through the heart of Central Oregon. The spring is about three weeks behind schedule this year, but the roads are in better condition now than they have been at this season for several years.

TACOMA JAPANESE BACK OF U. S.

TACOMA, Wash., May 31—The Japanese of Tacoma stand squarely behind the government in its preparation for active war against Germany. "Believing the government of the U. S. has just and righteous cause for war with Germany," resolutions adopted by the Tacoma Japanese Society reads. "We gladly assume any national obligation and, so far as in our power, will uphold the dignity and honor of the land of our adoption in its struggle to establish the principle of worldwide humanity."

QUAKERS TO FOLLOW PERSHING TO FRANCE

NEW YORK, May 31—The organization of a unit of 500 American Quakers to follow Pershing to France has started. They will join the British Quakers who are now at the front reclaiming devastated territory and aiding in the relief work.

SOLDIER'S MEET PASS RESOLUTION

STAND FOR NO ANNEXATION AND DECLARE WAR NECESSARY TO PEACE. RUSSIAN ARMY NEEDS MUNITIONS.

PETROGRAD, May 31—The Soldiers' delegates meeting here have passed a resolution supporting "no forced annexation and no punitive indemnities."

The resolution declares that "whoever wishes peace must prepare for war." It also says that more munitions must be supplied the Russian army if it is to hold its own against Germany.

this Government must be spent for supplies within this country. So when the United States lends two hundred million dollars to Great Britain, this Government merely assembles the credit of its people and lends that credit to Great Britain to enable Great Britain to enlarge its operations of buying our supplies. So while we are aiding Great Britain, by giving her a lower interest rate than she otherwise could get, we are aiding ourselves by providing new demands upon all of our industries, new demands for labor, large requirements of raw materials and a greater market for food supplies.

The administration has profited from the costly experience of other nations by outlining a policy which provides for a combination of borrowing and taxation in order to keep down the bad effects usually resultant from large borrowing have come where nations have raised all of their war revenue by the sale of bonds. Wherever a nation has undertaken to raise its taxation proportionately with its rate of borrowing, this tendency toward price inflation has been reduced. The

Secretary of the Treasury has made suggestions to Congress for an increase in taxation which would produce nearly two billion dollars annually. Germany has raised practically all of its war revenue by selling bonds and has added very little to taxation. Great Britain has followed the customary accepted policy of making increased taxation take care of at least the interest on increased indebtedness.

But this tendency to minimize price inflation is not the only saving grace in the new program of war finance. The Secretary of the Treasury, instead of calling for subscriptions to the entire loan at one time, called for only two billion dollars at once. His object was, manifestly, to distribute the shock of the loan. Such a program makes it possible for this money to be subscribed; to be loaned to European countries; to be expended for supplies in this country and to be again distributed to its normal channels of business before the next installment is called for. Such a plan makes it possible to handle the Liberty Loan by degrees with the least percentage of business displacement.

Another provision in the making of the Liberty Loan which helped to reduce its ill effects is the minimum was that giving the Secretary of the Treasury authority to deposit the money subscribed for bonds in banks throughout the country. It is his policy to distribute these deposits where the

money originates. Thus again is provided an excellent safeguard against business displacement.

The floating of this great loan will afford opportunity for getting a new angle on the saving habit of Americans. Heretofore Americans have not been satisfied with the low returns provided for government securities. They have not been buyers of Government bonds. It is said that less than one fifth of one per cent of the people of the United States are bond owners, and of course only a small portion of these are holders of Government bonds. In Great Britain and France nearly 12 per cent of the people have actually participated in the raising of war revenue by the purchase of bonds. On the basis of patriotic duty a great many Americans will now become bond holders and the practice of buying this class of securities will be stimulated.

In order to make this great loan a complete success: in order to minimize the evil effects; in order to distribute the shock so that business will not feel it, it will be absolutely necessary for the people at large to participate generously in the Liberty Loan. To require the banks and trust companies of this country, whose total loans for commercial purposes now are eighteen billions of dollars, to assume the bulk of a government credit of an additional seven billions would be subjecting the business of the nation to too great a strain.
