GARDEN INSECT PESTS

Because of the numerous insect pests which attack vegetable crops, a few brief hints on some of the more important pests and their control are offered. The recommendations are based on careful experiments and represent the most approved practices for control. These suggestions on pests and their control are offered by A. L. Lovett, associate professor of Entomology at O. A. C.

Cutworms—Before crops are planted, chop up succulent plants such as alfalfa, clover, mustard, etc., and to a gallon of the chopped leaves add one tablespoonful of white arsenic, paris green or lead arsenate and two table-spoonfuls of syrup or sugar.

After crops are in, use poison bran mash as follows: Bran, 10 pounds; white arsenic or paris green, 4 ounces; salt, 2 ounces; warm water to make a crumbly mash. Amount sufficient for one acre. Broadcast over field in the evening. For plants such as cabbage, tomatoes, etc., cylinders of stiff paper or tin (tin cans with bottoms melted out) may be placed about the plant, extending well down in the soil and projecting about two to three inches. Take care that no cutworms are inside when applying.

Grasshoppers—If grasshoppers appear, use bran mash formula above, substituting one-half ounce lemon extract for salt.

Slugs—Grayish or brownish, slimy, repulsive naked snails. Use vegetable bait as for cutworms. Dust soil with ashes or air-slaked lime. Dust plants with the following preparation: screen-

ed wood ashes or sulfur, 85 parts, powdered arsenate of lead, 15 parts.

Wireworms—Difficult to control. Write the Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Oregon, for special circular.

Flea Beetles—Small, shiny, brown or black beetles which jump like a flea when disturbed. Dust plants as recommended for slugs. Sent for special circular on flea beetles, wireworms, etc., at the Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Oregon.

Aphids or Plant Lice—Small soft bodied, green or black insects feeding in groups on under surface of leaves. Use liquid contact sprays; kerosene emulsion or tobacco sprays. The best for general use is water, 10 gallons; fish oil soap, 1 pound; black leaf 40, 1½ ounces (3 tablespoonfuls). Dissolve soap in small amount of boiling water. Make up to ten gallons and add black leaf.

Cabbage Worm—Dust plants at 10-day intervals with sifted wood ashes or sulfur, 85 parts; powdered arsenate of lead, 15 parts, until plants commence to head, and later if worms become bad.

Spotted Beetle—About size of lady bug. Yellowish green with black spots. See under cucumber insects.

Spotted Cucumber Beetle—About the size of lady bug, greenish yellow, with black spots. Dust plants with material recommended for cabbage worms. Leave a few plants of beans, squash or similar attractive plant untreated on which they may collect. Kill them here by mechanical means.

Corn Ear Worm—Eats into tip of ear, appearance of cutworm. Frequent surface cultivation of much value.

When silks "shoot," dust sulfur and arsenate down into tip of ears (see cabbage worm) at eight day intervals until silks dry up. Use can with perforated cover, and treat two rows at a time.

FORSEES PROSPERITY

total amount of financing that the government will have to do to cover its own expenditures, and to extend the necessary credits to the allied governments will amount to \$10,000,000,000. It is proposed that only 18 per cent of this colossal sum, namely \$1,800,000,000 shall be raised by new taxation. When one considers the magnitude of this task and the probable economic effects of the sale of \$8,200,000,000 of bonds within twelve months and the expenditure of the proceeds in the purchase of supplies in this country, it does not seem prudent or wise to provide by new taxation a less amount than \$1,800,000,000.

"There is always a serious danger of hurtful inflation in war time, when such great bond issues must be made. A reasonable amount of wholesome taxation, properly distributed, is the best corrective. The worst mistake made by the federal government at the outbreak of the civil war was its failure to impose taxation vigorously and sufficiently. This led to a train of evils, hurtful to the credit of the government and resulted in unnecessary sacrifice of human life and treasure.

"We shall not fail if everyone does his duty, but I warn you that these great things do not achieve themselves. They can only be achieved through the combined energy, determi-

nation and spirit of the American people. It is not enough of an answer to the challenge thrown down to us that we subscribe grudgingly or barely \$2,000,000,000 of Liberty Bonds. We must oversubscribe this loan. Our answer to the military autocracies of the earth must be that the American people have billions to sacrifice in the cause of liberty and self government throughout the world.

"The overshadowing danger to civilization today is the German military autocracy. The Kaiser, with a limitless and lustful ambition unparalleled in history, has set out upon a scheme of universal dominion. In order to win he has determined that neither the laws of humanity nor the rights of any nation shall stand in the way; that is the reason he has committed these in-sufferable aggressions upon the American nation.

"Do you know what would happen if Germany should be victorious, and she would be she could bring France and England to their knees? She would take the entire British and French fleets, release her own great fleet, which has been tied up in the Baltic during the war, and combining these with the most destructive submarine fleet on earth—because she has it—she would come here and put the iron heel of conqueror upon our shores. We should have to fall back to the interior and there is no telling how long it would take to expel the enemy, if we ever did. If we couldn't do it promptly, do you know what would happen to America? We should have to make the most humiliating terms that any great nation ever made to get peace. We should have to pay an indemnity that would represent probably half the wealth of America, which is \$250,000,000,000, and you would have taxation

upon your shoulders to meet that indemnity for a century to come.

"The first thing we must do is to raise the money to equip our armies and put them in the field, and to extend credit to the great nations of Europe which are co-operating with us.
