OREGON ADOPTS NEW SYSTEM

OPENING OF COLLEGE SET FOR OCTOBER 1—IDEA IS TO BENEFIT THOSE ENGAGED IN PRODUCTIVE LABOR

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, June 12.—In line with the recommendations made to the college presidents at the recent conference in Washington, by the council of national defense, the University of Oregon has adopted the three-quarter schedule in place of the present two semester plan.

The new schedule will go into effect with the opening of the university in the fall, and as a part of the plan the opening is set for October 1st, or approximately two weeks later than usual. The system as adopted by the faculty is for the period of the war.

The purpose of the change, as explained by President Campbell, is to make it possible for men engaged in such productive vocations as farming, which is particularly vital at this time, to complete two-thirds of a college year's work in six months and to devote the remaining half of the year to directly productive occupations. The two-semester plan does not lend itself readily to such an arrangement. The three-quarter plan, as adopted, is an adaptation of the system used in the University of Chicago, where it has been employed for years.

The schedule as adopted involves the opening of the college year October 1st. The first quarter extends to December 21st. The second quarter opens January 2, continuing to March 22, and the spring term extends from April 1st to June 17th. The summer session will continue as at present, on the basis of half a school quarter. Further details and schedule of hours and courses will appear in the university catalog soon to be issued.

ITALIAN NAVY HAS PRESS AND PUBLICITY OFFICE

TELLS PEOPLE WHAT NAVY IS DOING IN WAR

Encourages Development of Italy's Merchant Marine—Office in Rome in Charge of Naval Officer—One Dozen Writers on Staff—Supplies Papers at Home and Abroad, and Has Publication of Its Own.

ROME, May 31.—(Correspondence)—The Italian navy has established a press and publicity office to let the world know what Italy is doing in the war and, frankly, to advertise the Italian nation and correct the century-old impressions entertained abroad regarding the people who live in Italy, their qualities and their ambitions.

The navy publicity office also is attempting to encourage the development of the Italian merchant marine, showing that a country almost surrounded by the sea should extend her seafaring interests. The office, which is in Rome, is in charge of a naval officer of captain's rank, who acts as censor. The managing editor has a staff of a dozen newspaper writers, who make it their business to travel with different naval vessels, visit scenes of disaster, report battles and submarine captures and write special articles. All of their work is prepared by the managing editor and then distributed to the Italian newspapers and reviews.

In addition, if a special writer from some local or foreign newspaper or review wishes to get information first hand, he is examined regarding his credentials, and these being satisfactory, is given permission to travel when and where he pleases, his articles later being subject to censor, as on the army front.

The press bureau also has its own publication, La Marina, and its moving picture department. One of its useful means of securing publicity is the arrangement of lectures by prominent persons, the lecturer being furnished with either a moving picture film or lantern slides. Arrangements have been made for such lectures in the United States.

Rose Festival Opens; Colors Bedeck City

PORTLAND, June 12.—Portland was bedecked in the national colors and bright with flowers for the opening of the 1917 patriotic Rose Festival today. Throngs of visitors are arriving for the three days of festivities. Several thousand boys and girls, dressed in Red Cross nurse uniforms and army khaki, will march this afternoon in the children's parade. Tonight, President Wilson will formally open the festival when he presides a telegraph key in Washington and unveils a mammoth replica of the statue of liberty erected in the Court of Patri-

otism at the Festival Center here. Following the unveiling there will be music and speeches, the principal one of which will be delivered by State Supreme Judge Wallace McCamant. His subject will be "France and America—Champions of Liberty." Tomorrow will be National Flag Day, the program centering around a patriotic parade in which patriotic societies, fraternal organizations and military units will march. Adjutant General George A. White will be grand marshal. A military ball will be held tonight at night.

SEATTLE WATER SHOW JULY 5-7

SAN FRANCISCO, June 12.—A tentative program of the great Seattle water carnival to take place July 5, 6 and 7, has been prepared and plans are maturing. All manner of craft, from every section of the country, will be invited to participate. The feature will be an Alaskan cruise, the fleet to depart from Seattle on July 7th, the last day of the racing carnival. This cruise is said to be the longest ever attempted by a combined flotilla of pleasure craft. The entire program is in the hands of the Seattle Yacht Club. E. 55 feet distant from angle in Conger avenue at corner to E. R. Reames and Lindsay Applegate property as shown in Vol. 1, page 5, Record of Town Surveys; thence along the arc of a vertical curve, at 25 feet, elevation 158.1 at 50 feet, elevation 158.2 at 75 feet, elevation 158.1 at 100 feet, elevation 157.4 thence on a uniform grade to elevation 146.7 to terminus of Conger avenue as platted on page 5 of said Record of Town Surveys; thence on a uniform grade 624.85 feet to elevation 148.0 at present terminus of Conger avenue. 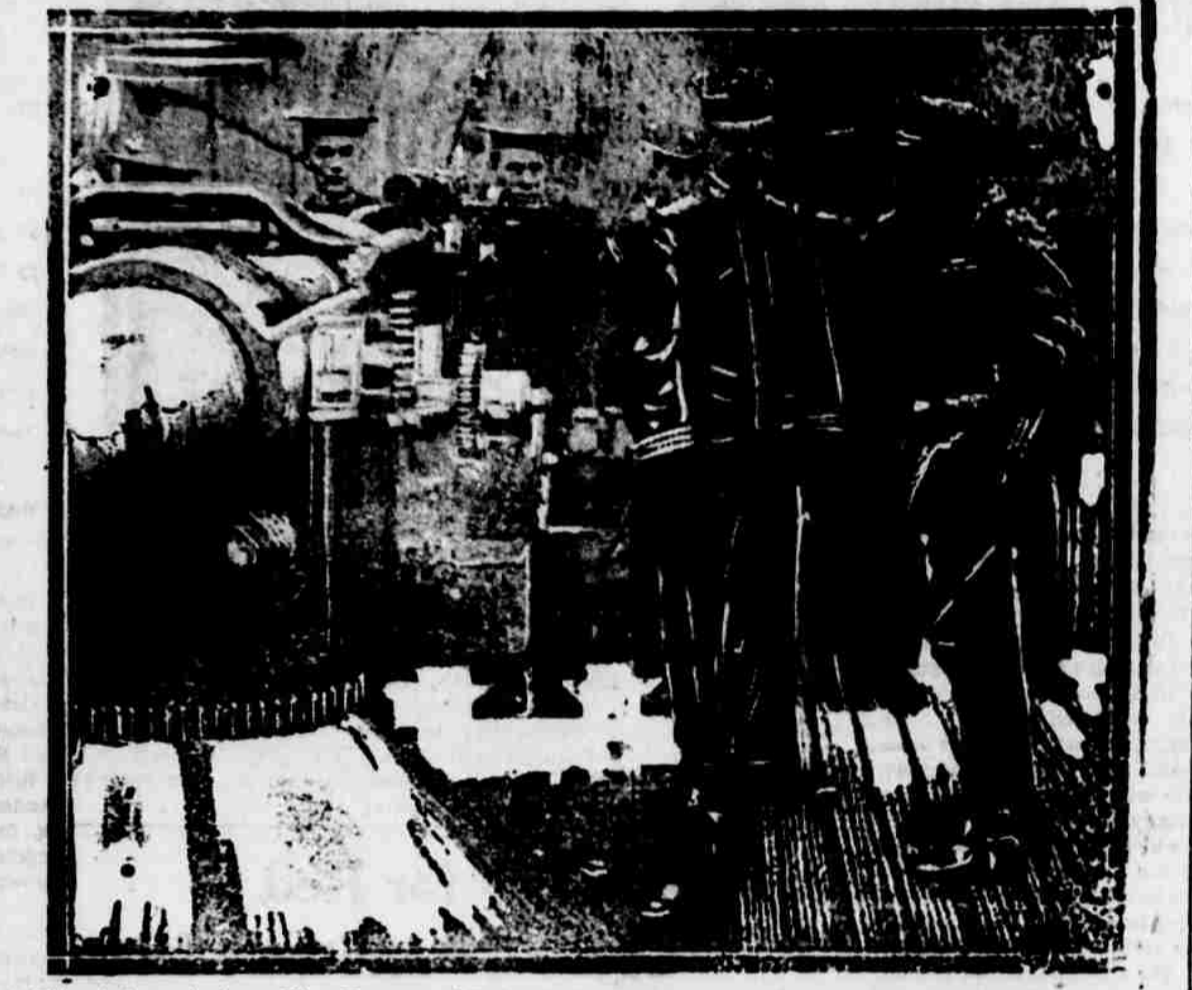

OBTAINS OFFICER'S UNIFORM AND TOURS GARRISON TOWNS IN GERMANY AND SAXONY WITH GIRL

LONDON, June 12.—A German locksmith from Berlin has been sentenced at Cassel, Germany, to six months' imprisonment for an unusual exploit. The locksmith, a youth of 20, obtained possession of the uniform of a captain, and accompanied by a girl friend, made a tour of garrison towns in Central Germany, especially Saxony. He described himself as captain of a mine-throwing company, and with the aid of false stamps had provided himself with the requisite papers. He arrived at each barracks decorated with numerous medals, and in each case inspected the military guard, and then filed out orders granting leave to a certain number of officers and men, and signed free passes for their railway journey to wherever they wished to go.
