INDIANS MEET TO DISCUSS MATTERS

FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATION
OCCASION FOR DISCUSSION OF TRIBAL MATTERS AND TIMBER ESTATES

KLAMATH AGENCY, June 15.—The Indians on the Klamath reservation are going to hold a meeting during the celebration on July 4th, or soon after, as they will as usual congregate.

The matter of disposing of the tribal timber on the reservation and their estates will be discussed with a view towards taking congress to legislate laws either to sell all of the tribal estates or a part of the same, and also to have a voice in the matter of the management and control of their tribal property interests.

The July 4th celebration will be held at Fort Klamath. Among the attractions will be horse racing, bucking horse contests, ball games, sold sports and other events.

Some Warm Spring Indians are expected to take part in the celebration.

KLAMATH AGENCY, June 15.—The people on the reservation are expecting to have a competency commission visit the Klamath reservation this summer.

Clayton Kirk was assured of their visit when in Washington this spring. The commission is visiting a number of reservations in the United States to view the conditions of the Indians and their progress under government control, after which they will issue a report.
