Whereas, it is deemed expedient to change the present grade as established on that portion of Conger avenue northerly from the center line of California avenue,

Be it Therefore Resolved that the Common Council declares its intention to change the grade of said portion of

Conger avenue to the grade as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Conger avenue with center line of California avenue with elevation 159.87; thence on a uniform grade to elevation 157.6 at a point N. 48 deg. 23 min. E. 65 feet distant from angle in Conger avenue at corner to E. R. Reames and Lindsay Applegate property as shown in Vol. 1, page 5, Record of Town Surveys; thence along the arc of a vertical curve,

at 25 feet, elevation 158.1
 at 50 feet, elevation 158.3
 at 75 feet, elevation 158.1
 at 100 feet, elevation 157.4

thence on a uniform grade to elevation 146.7 to terminus of Conger avenue as platted on page 5 of said Record of Town Surveys; thence on a uniform grade 624.85 feet to elevation 148.0 at present terminus of Conger avenue.
