Every girl was eager to purchase at her hands, and many returned to the counter for a superfluous packet of chocolate or a bun, just for the sake of another smile from the princess.

FLORENCE ART DEALER BUYS ON PAINTING

PARIS, June 29.—Alfred Geri, the dealer in antiquities of Florence, Italy, thru whom Leonardo de Vinci's celebrated painting, the Joconde, was restored to the Louvre museum, has brought action against the French government to recover a premium of 10 per cent of the value of the picture. Estimating it to be worth 1,000,000 francs, he asks for 100,000 francs.

The French government refused the claim, and the case will come up in court at an early date.

Deserters From German Army Flock to Holland

THE HAGUE, June 15.—(Correspondence)—Thousands of deserters, mostly from the German army, now are swelling the stream of refugees pouring into Holland from adjoining countries. Holland has become a great place of refuge for fugitives fleeing from the horrors of the German front, food hardships or the German military regime.

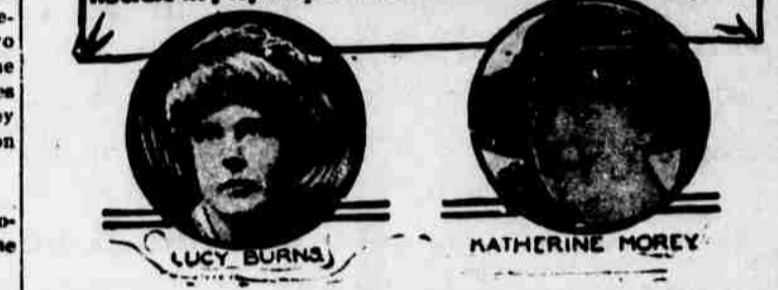
So numerous have these war refugees become that a weekly periodical, called "The Combat," has been established at Amsterdam to carry on a revolutionary socialist propaganda among them. A Society of Deserters has been formed in Holland, apparently by German agents, in order to discover the names of deserters and exert pressure on their families to induce them to return to Germany. Returning deserters no longer are shot, but are sent to the front.

The country is overrun by a small army of spies, persons of both sexes, whose work is to spy into Dutch affairs, to spy upon the belligerents, and sometimes to spy upon one another.

JAP GENERAL VISITS CHINESE

TRIP CAUSES MUCH COMMENT, AS JAPANESE HAVE BEEN CHARGED WITH MEDDLING IN CHINA AFFAIRS

NANKING, China, June 13.—The visit of Lieutenant General Tanaka, vice chief of the Japanese general staff, to China, has caused much comment.

He went to Tsing-tau and other points in Shantung province, where the Japanese have been charged by the Chinese with helping revolutionists, and in other ways undermining Chinese authority. Chinese officials extended General Tanaka every courtesy at Tsinanfu and other places of importance visited by him. He was entertained at many dinners before he reached Nanking.

Chinese newspapers have commented widely on the visit of General Tanaka at a time when internal affairs are so unsettled in the republic and the anti-Japanese press has made many bitter attacks on the mission, which was denounced as one designed to cause further uneasiness.
