SOLDIERS LEARN FRENCH FOR WAR

The following letter has been received by the Evening Herald from Fred Eubank of Fort Klamath, now a member of the Twenty-first Infantry, U. S. A.:

"Being that I hail from Fort Klamath, Klamath County, Oregon, I think it would be my duty to send the Evening Herald a little write up to let the folks at home know how they're treating the boys in the U. S. army."

"At present the Twenty-first Infantry which I have joined is camped in San Diego, Calif., in the center of the Panama-Pacific exposition ground. There are also 3,000 sailors in training here from Goat Island, San Francisco, Calif."

"Our drill hours are from 6 a. m. to 11:30 p. m. in the morning; in the afternoon from 1:30 p. m. to 3 p. m. We have plenty to eat of good, substantial food, also good clean sleeping quarters."

"We are all anxious to leave for France, to fight for our country and liberty."

"At present we are learning French at the expense of Uncle Sam."

On the front seat of the coach with the driver was shot gun agent John Foster, agent for Wells Fargo at Agor for thirty years.

Mr. Adams was the pony express rider and rode in 1858 when St. Louis to San Francisco was a ten day ride for the thru mail.

Following the coach was one of the large local Wells Fargo wagons with an O. E. R. R. express car as a trailer in which Carl Adams was the messenger.

Following was the Strahorn engine float, an elaborate reproduction of an engine emerging from a tunnel drawn by four bay horses, remarkable lifelike and distinctive.

Then came an automobile containing Mr. and Mrs. M. Murgittroyd of Spokane, Captain J. W. Siemens and others, and Mr. Strahorn machine with Mrs. Strahorn, Mrs. E. Hall and others of the 1000 club.

Next followed J. F. Arant's machine with Mrs. Arant, Mrs. McDonald and other pioneers of Klamath County.

The Odd Fellows section followed next, a most elaborate lodge displayed by a large float with a huge arch, the officers and Mrs. R. E. Wattenburg, past grand president, of these Rebeccas assembled. Then came the Odd Fellows carrying three huge decorated links, typifying in colors the subordinate lodge in red, the Rebeccas in pink and the encampment in purple.

Following this was the elaborate Elk's float with Miss Clara Calkins as queen driving a huge Elk with decorated horns and the lodge colors. She was attended by six little girls as maids.

Following these features were many decorated automobiles, a float by Swift and company and a decorated automobile entered by the White Pelican Garage.
