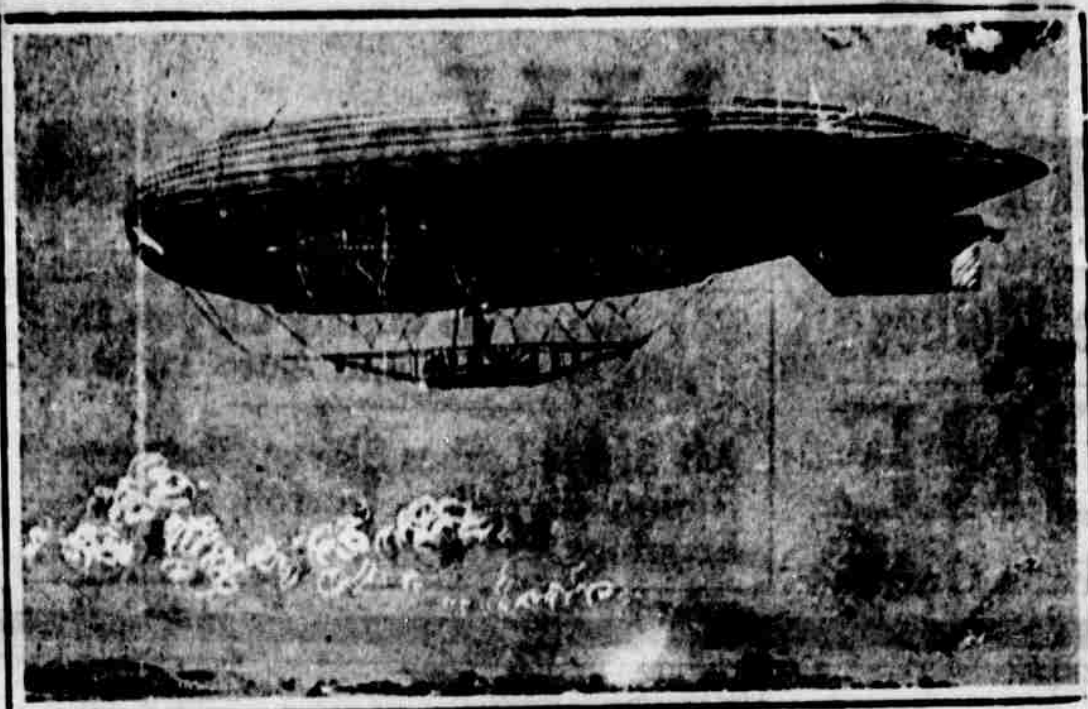


United States Naval Dirigible DN-1 on Trial Flight

made in this section. The transformation of nearly every community from a "wild and woolly" stage, thru the "tin horn" period, was given in the Bishop's inimitable style, and his declaration quoted from a former occasion, that he "would rather take an active hand in making history in the West than sit up nights wet-nursing history for other men in the East," was warmly applauded. Knowledge and character were two essentials named by Bishop Hughes as vital to progress and the importance of the latter accompanying the former was forcibly emphasized.

Robert E. Strahorn concluded the program by renewing his pledge of allegiance to the enterprise, declaring he devoted his entire time and resources to its satisfactory completion. He deprecated the "breadth of vision" credited to him in a number of the day's speeches with the statement that it was merely taking thoughtful advantage of knowledge already attained. That the possibilities of Eastern Oregon surpass those of Washington was stated.

Waldo D. Paine, head of the Hill line interests in Washington and Oregon, paid high tribute to Strahorn's genius, gained thru years of former association. He predicted that a town that could do what Klamath Falls has done, linked with a man of Strahorn's capability, would develop any country.

George D. Putnam, representing Governor Withycombe, and W. D. Cheyne of Seattle made very delightful short talks. P. L. Albrecht of Silver Lake and F. L. Young of Paisley brought a message of gratitude and co-operation from Central Oregon. H. D. Mortenson, Charles Wood

Eberlein and W. A. Deisell made interesting talks on different phases of the railroad's significance. The entertainment lasted until nearly 1 o'clock.

designated port in England, is intolerable. If Imperial Germany can dictate our commercial policy, this planet is not worth living on for a freedom-loving nation.

The other lesson taught is that until men can retain standards of civilization we shall still have to have an adequate army and navy. A man would be a fool to get behind a mule and sing Home, Sweet Home, and anyone who would attempt to recite the Ten Commandments and the Golden Rule to a mad dog is an ass. A man may thoroughly believe in peace without being a fool. At first we could not believe stories of atrocities committed by the Germans in Europe, but now every open minded man and woman has been forced to realize that the awfullest force outside of hell has been let loose in Europe for the last three years.

"Information of these atrocities has come not from propaganda of the allies, but from letters of soldiers written to their families. War is not glorious. It means ruined villages, devastated cities, pestilence, famine, the cry of wounded heart-breaks, the loosening of all moral restraint. As Sherman has put it, "War is hell," and you could not expect a Methodist Bishop to stand up and deliver a eulogy on the infernal regions.

"Only the motive can sanctify war, according to Bishop Hughes. The war is not glorious. Men who give their lives to war become glorious because of their reason for taking up arms. It is possible to pay too big

a price for peace, and we do not want peace with dishonor. War in itself does not settle anything, and this war will settle nothing except that some one will be profoundly licked.

The success of war depends upon the men who sit around the table and discuss peace terms, but the best time to arbitrate is when you are sitting on the fellow you've licked. People who are ambitious must be made to listen to reason by means of war. We are still suffering from some of the evils of the Civil War. Our high finance way of running city and state governments runs from the Civil War. We are still paying taxes resulting from that conflict, but the lessons taught us by that struggle have been taken advantage of during the present crisis, and we now begin to tighten up the moral restraint at the beginning of the war, under the leadership of the government.

"The present crisis is characterized by absence of bitterness of feeling. German speaking Americans are loyal to this government because they came over here to escape just what the German imperial government is trying to clamp on Europe.

"The West has gone far ahead of the East in enlistment, and has made the East ashamed of itself, and it takes considerable to do that. The East has a great population which cannot be assimilated. The crowds of foreigners which gazed stolidly at the parades, had as much idea of their significance as the ox who stares stupidly at the glorious sunset. At the conclusion of the war it is to be hoped that American citizenship will have some value, instead of being the cheapest thing we have to give away. Like the Romans of old, our citizenship should be our proudest possession."

IN EAST ST. LOUIS WITH ORGY
OF BUTCHERY AND INCEN-

Seven blocks have been swept by fire with a loss of over \$200,000. Five hundred whites have been arrested and disarmed, and 1,500 militiamen are patrolling the streets. White women beat negro women as they fled from their homes.
