HSUN IS BOXED BY REPUBLICANS

ROYALIST LEADER DRIVEN TO SHELTER IN PEKING TEMPLES THE END OF THE DYNASTY MOVEMENT BELIEVED NEAR

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 10 .-General Chang Haun, imperial leader in the attempt to restore the Manchu dynasty of China, is reported by Ministar Reinsch to have withdrawn his troops into the Imperial city and Temple of Heaven, two of the most beautiful sections of Peking.

Loyal republican troops surround the city, and complete distruction of the monarchial government is considered only a matter of a short

A dispatch just received says that the republican government has announced confirmation of General Fong Kwo as president. It has been decided to banish the emperor and the imperial family and the monarchist princes from Poking.

Another dispatch says that a re-publican airplane bombed the imperiel palace.
