The fire is believed to have been ately, but such a start had been gained before it could arrive on the scene that it was impossible to get it under control. In about two hours the entire mill was in ruins, and it was only thru the heroic efforts of the department that the surrounding industries were saved.

The loss of the mill and supplies is estimated at \$150,000. The amount of insurance has not been announced.

OUNTY AGRICULTURIST AGENT GLAISYER IS FOUND DOING EF. PECTIVE WORK BY STATE LEADER PAUL V. MARIS

That good work is being done here by County Agricultural Agent H. R. Glaisyer was declared by State Leader Paul V. Maris, who left yesterday after a day's visit going over the different lines of the work

"The regular work of the year has been seriously broken into this year by the campaign for increased food supply. In which the agricultural agents were called upon by the federal authorities to co-operate, and in which they have been of great service to the nation," said Mr. Maris. "If the war should continue there will probably be twice as many men in the field as now, because the service they are able to render is vital to the government at such times.
