POOR PROSPECTS FOR

CROPS IN SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, July 28.—Crop reports from all provinces of Sweden for May 31 show an average condition for the whole kingdom markedly below a medium yield for most crops. Two weeks of scorching drought since the date of this report will have materially lowered this average. Some provinces report almost a total failure of cereal crops. The figures for the most important crops follow, marked on the basis of five for a very good crop, four, good; three, medium; two, decidedly below medium, and one, practically a failure: Winter wheat, 2.5; winter rye, 2; spring wheat, 2.7; spring rye, 2.9; barley, 3; oats, 2.9; beans, 2.8; potatoes, 2.6; sugar beets, 2.6; hay, 2.7.

Military Curriculum Emphasized at O. A. C.

CORVALLIS, July 28.—Military instruction in one form or another will be given in almost every technical department of the Oregon Agricultural College when it opens next October, according to announcements made by the college authorities. Wireless and signalling will be taught by the physics department, military business methods and accounting will be explained in the school of commerce, methods of handling heavy mobile artillery will be taught in the logging engineering department, the mechanical engineering department will instruct in ordnance work and the physical education department is to offer a course for men and women in Red Cross work and another to men only in exercises including scaling of walls, jumping trenches and sword and bayonet fencing.

MARRIAGE PROBLEM TROUBLES THE BISHOP

LONDON, July 28.—The Bishop of Peterborough is worried about the marriage problem after the war, and has called attention to the possibility that, in view of the number of men killed in the war, women may have more difficulty in finding husbands than heretofore.

"One grave question of the future," he said, "possibly the near future, is the idea of marriage which will prevail. It is possible that the holy estate will be attacked in a way we have never known; we may be confronted by efforts of many people, in view of the present unprecedented situation.

"What is to be the equivalent of munition and other work," he asked, "where are the forces that have been generated to find their outlet? Some scope there must be for the surpassing energy the war has brought forth. To that problem the church must find the answer, and not a mere routine answer."
