BRANCH GERMAN FACTORIES PLANNED FOR SWEDEN

COPENHAGEN, Aug. 2.—Germany is believed to be making preparations for the establishment in Denmark and Sweden of a large number of branches of well known German factories and industrial firms, says the Svenska Dagbladet.

These plans, if carried out, would be very detrimental to neutral trade, since the countries of the allies would be naturally suspicious of all neutral firms which might be serving German interests. The paper suggests a combination of industry and finance to offset this German influence.
