Women of Nation Asked to Help Hoover

PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 10—House to house campaign thrust Oregon to obtain pledges from approximately 200,000 housewives that they will carry out the advice of Herbert Hoover and the United States Food Administration in the conduct of their household will be begun immediately, the State Council of Defense has announced.

Members of various women's civic, fraternal and social organizations have help in the task of obtaining signatures for the pledge cards, which are to be forwarded to the food administration at Washington when signed. The pledges, addressed to

the food administrator, read as follows:

"I am glad to join you in the service of food conservation for our nation, and I hereby accept membership in the United States Food Administration, pledging myself to carry out the directions and advice of the food administrator in the conduct of my household, insofar as my circumstances permit."

First instructions regarding food conservation and a household tag to be hung in the window of the home of the signer will be sent from Washington free to all women signing the cards. For ten cents the official food administration button and, if desired, the shield insignia of the food administration will be sent.

RAILROAD EARNINGS INCREASE

WASHINGTON, August 10—Net earnings of America's railroads during June showed an increase over the same month for 1916, despite the fact that the 115 per cent rate raise desired by them was refused.

Figures made public Tuesday showed that 155 railroads during June earned \$28,323,339 net, compared with \$20,405,183 in June, last year.

WANT BACK TAXES PAID

DISTRICT ATTORNEYS OF GRANT LAND COUNTIES WILL PRESS MOVEMENT FOR PAYMENT OF BACK TAXES AND INTEREST.

SALEM, Or., Aug. 10—District attorneys of the western Oregon counties in which lands of the Oregon-California railroad grant are located, have decided to ask the Oregon delegation in Congress to press passage of a bill now pending providing for the payment by the federal government of the interest on the back taxes on the lands soon to be paid the state by the government. Recently United States Attorney General Gregory ruled that the Chamberlain-Ferris bill provided that the government should pay the back taxes, but no interest.
