They believe that the entire program for something better may crash in the pan. Meanwhile, new building continues, rails are being laid for a municipal railroad, thou-

sands of acres of land are being reclaimed. There are still some who say it is all a dream. The Eastern man who came again and was converted, leaves for home tomorrow, via the Apache Trail. He says he goes to the Southwest that he may report at home that he has seen everything in this new land which has done so much in so short a time. He will spread the gospel of the New West, and will return East convinced. And when these investigators cross the country again they will bring their goods and their bank book with them. The duty of the true Westerner is to help bring the first man here. He is the fellow who will start the settlers to new homes across the land. The true lover of the West will not leave all of this work to the chambers of commerce. The real booster will take his pen in hand, and during this period when the men of wealth are forced to stay in America he will urge them to come to the West and spend sufficient time here to really study the resources.
