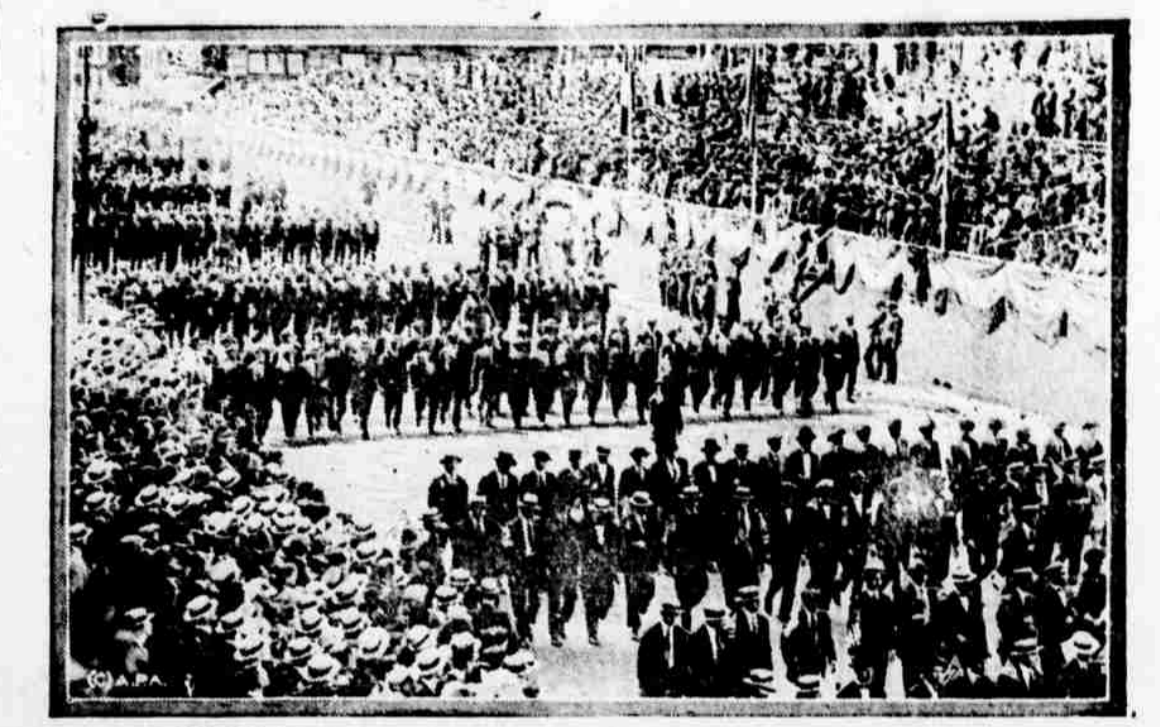

## Legion of Death Will Stand By Government

Famous Fighting Battalion of Women Will Offer Their Lives For the Protection of Kerensky. Their Brave Stand Shames Many Male Citizens

PETROGRAD, Sept. 13.—Russia's women soldiers will die for Premier Kerensky if need be.

The "Legion of Death" has been reformed, and is ready to fight wherever they may be ordered.

"We must show the world we are willing to die for Russia," declared Madame Butchkoreva, commander of the legion, as she left with a score of women recruits for Moscow, there to gather more women soldiers.

"We will assemble 250 more women, every one of whom will die, if need be, for Russia's freedom."

Hundreds of citizens, who had fought for places in the ticket lines, were shamed by the spectacle of Mme. Butchkoreva dressed in army uniform, assembling a group of girls and women at the station.

Two or three male officers formed the girls into something akin to military formation.

"These are recruits," the commander declared. "We are now en route to Moscow. There will be more waiting to take our oath to do or die."

Petrograd is awaiting expectantly for the first military orders from the new provisional commander in chief

## Men Badly Needed In Ordinance Department

There is now an increasing demand for men in nearly all lines of the government service, and civil service examinations are being held almost continuously for openings in some of the various departments.

Owing to urgent need of men with technical training of certain kinds, the ordinance department of the army will hold open competitive examinations in the several ordinance establishments of the war department or in or under the chief of ordinance, war department, Washington, D.C., which are open at this time, in the following lines. The salaries named are for entrance.

- Mechanical engineer, experimental work, \$2,500 to \$3,000 year.
- Mechanical draftsman, \$1,000 to \$1,400 year.
- Apprentice draftsman, \$480 year.
- Inspector of artillery ammunition, \$1,900 to \$2,500 year.
- Inspector of field artillery ammunition steel, \$1,500 to \$2,400 year.
- Assistant inspector of field artillery ammunition steel, \$3.50 to \$5 day.
- Inspector of ammunition packing boxes, \$3.52 day to \$1,800 year.
- Inspector and assistant inspector of powder and explosives, \$1,400 to \$2,400 year.
- Inspector of ordinance equipment, \$1,500 to \$2,400 year.

## FOUR ARRESTED FOLLOWING RAID

NEWSPAPER MEN CONNECTED WITH PHILADELPHIA TAGEBLATT CHARGED WITH VIOLATION OF ESPIONAGE ACT

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 13.—Four members of the staff of the Philadelphia Tageblatt, whose offices were raided recently by government agents, are now under arrest, and the remaining two for whom warrants have been issued will appear in time for hearing today.

All are charged with violating the espionage act thru the publication of articles alleged to be inimical to the interests of the United States.

Louis Welner, editor in chief, and Waldimir Alfredo, an editorial writer, surrendered to the federal authorities, and were held in \$1,000 bail each. Peter Schaeffer, president of the publishing company, and Paul Vogel, treasurer, the other two men wanted, are in Cincinnati, and their counsel promised they would be here
