Miss Grace Hayes of Yreka is visiting Miss Bertha Lawdebaugh at the home of Mrs. Harry Richardson.

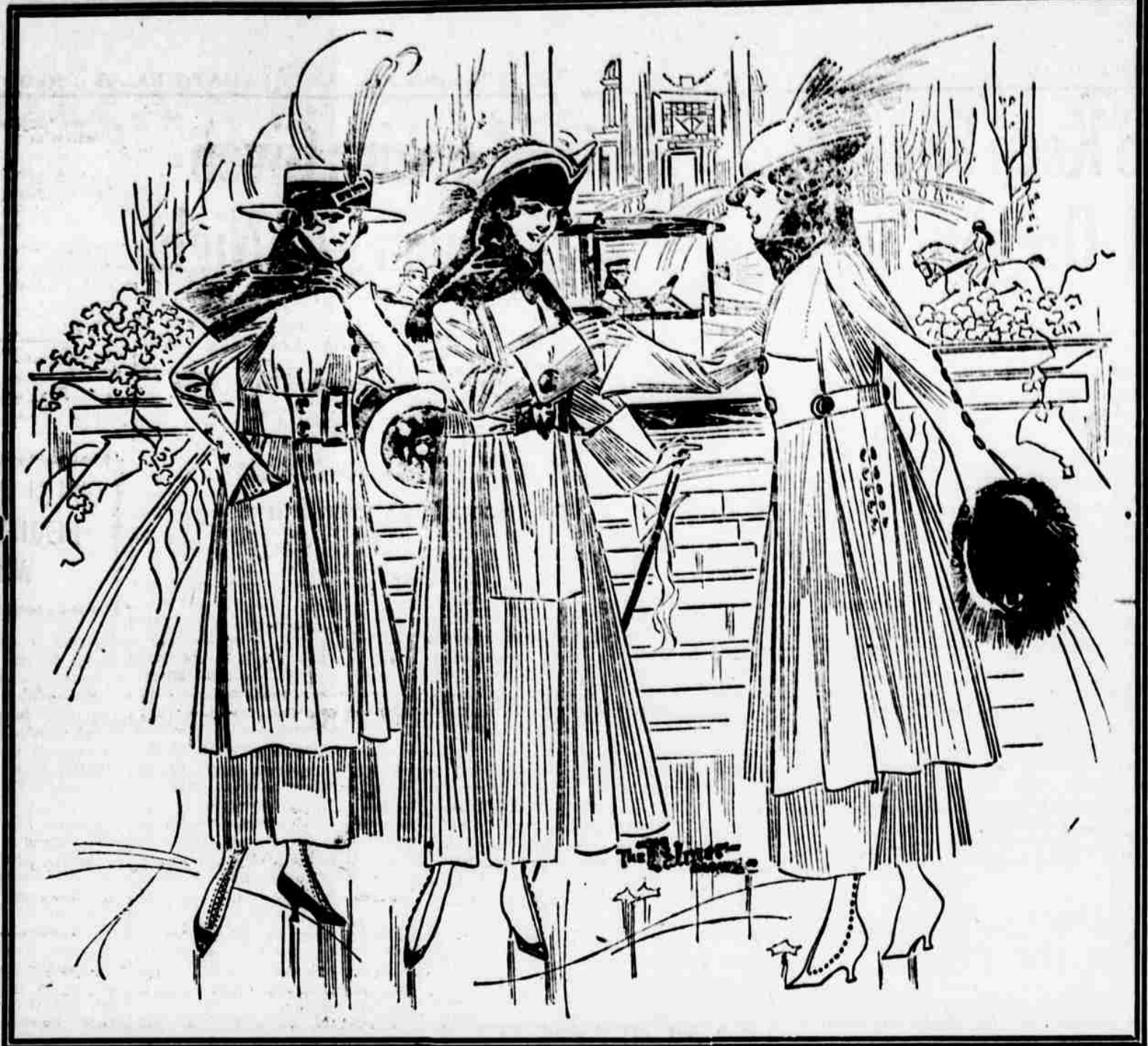
Mr. and Mrs. William Finley and Miss Alma Finley of Portland arrived last night for a brief visit in this city.
