**FIRST AID CLASS
TO START HERE**

SERIES OF LECTURES UNDER AUSPICES OF RED CROSS, BY DR. A. A. SOULE TO BE COMMENCED IN NEAR FUTURE

The latest feature of Red Cross work to be taken up in this city is a First Aid Class, which will be organized under the auspices of the local chapter, to enter a course of study for aid in accidents and acute illness.

A series of ten lectures are to be given between this and the first of the year by Dr. A. A. Soule, who will also direct the course of study.

Although this course does not finally prepare for Red Cross work in the field, an examination may be taken by all those who wish upon its completion, and a certificate of proficiency will be issued to those who pass it successfully.

The lectures and demonstrations are expected to commence about the middle of October, and will be given once a week thereafter. The time required for each session will be about an hour and a half.

Those wishing to enroll for this work can do so for the nominal fee of 50 cents. A text book costing 25 cents will also be required. The lectures will be given at the Red Cross headquarters in the Orpheus building.

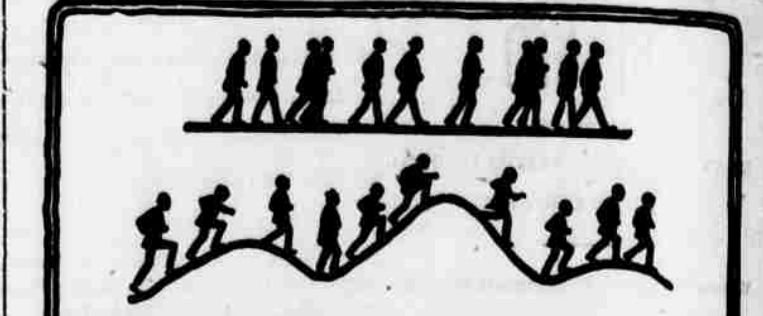
