"Grunters" Drill Sounds Realistic

FORT BLISS, Texas, Oct. 8.—The "grunTERS" drill is what the troopers stationed here call the daily bayonet exercises, which are held on the sandy drill ground in front of officers' row.

With wooden bayonets instead of the sharp steel ones, the cavalrymen are divided into squads which oppose each other, and they then go thru the motions of bayonet charges, parry enemy thrusts and fence skillfully

with their rifles. As they go thru the motions of stabbing the enemy, the men grunt loudly with each thrust. A thrust to the abdomen and a grunt. A quick upper thrust to the chin and another grunt, followed by a quick series of short arm stabs to the breast of the fictitious German and more grunts.

These throaty sounds are all given in unison, and give the drill a gruesome touch of realism.

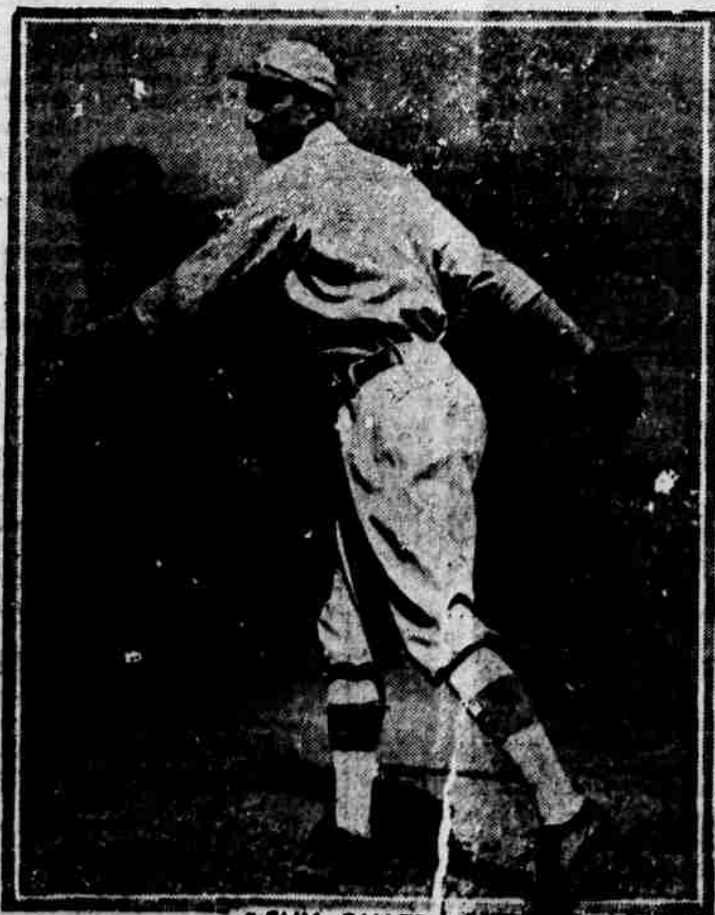

NEW MEXICAN REVOLT BEGINS

PORFIRIO GONZALEZ, PREVIOUS SUPPORTER OF CARRANZA, ORGANIZES BAND OF 800 TO OVERTHROW GOVERNMENT

BROWNSVILLE, Tex., Oct. 8.—A revolt against the Mexican government has been started by General Porfirio Gonzale, a former commander under Carranza.

He has mobilized 800 followers at Aldamas, near Matamoros, 100 miles from the Mexican border, according to reports reaching here.
