## Greatest Hero of the War Who May Have Been Lost

Captain Georges Guynemer, greatest individual hero the war has yet produced among the allies, is believed to have been lost behind the German lines. He rose in his aeroplane September 11th from Dunkirk, and has not been seen since. It is feared he fell behind the German lines, and he may have died fighting. If so, the greatest aviator the war has yet produced, the greatest hero among the allied armies, who has brought down some eighty enemy planes, is gone. The official count credits Captain Guynemer with having brought down fifty-three German machines, but only those which fell within the French lines were counted. He brought down many more which fell within the German lines.

### POPE WOULD END AIR RAIDS

GENEVA, Oct. 10.—Pausing in his peace efforts, Pope Benedict XV. is now endeavoring to end air attacks against unfortified cities, in which only non-combatants suffer.

It is understood that representations have already been made to Berlin and Vienna, with a view to stopping German raids over English and French soil and Austro-Hungarian attacks against Italian cities.

The pontiff believes if the central powers discontinue their raids the allies will not engage in reprisals.
