Coming Sabbath to Be Liberty Loan Sunday

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 18.—An appeal has been issued to the entire clergy of the nation asking for their co-operation in the sale of the second issue of the Liberty bonds, and naming October 21st as Liberty Bond Sunday, on which date patriotic celebrations are to be held in the churches.

The following suggestions are made by O. A. Price, director of publicity for the Second Liberty Loan at Washington, for observing the day: "I would suggest that you have leaflets containing the 'Star Spangled Banner' and 'America' printed and distributed to the congregations, with the request that they be sung during the services.

Serbian Conditions Are Now Critical

LONDON, Sept. 30.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—The situation in Serbia today is summed up in a communication received by the British socialist party from the executive committee of the Serbian socialists. It says: "The Serbian population in the portions of our country occupied by Austria-Hungary is now 2,218,000, according to official census figures published in the official journal at Belgrade. The population normally would have been 3,170,000. There is, therefore, a reduction of 952,000, or 28 per cent. The male population has been reduced by 38 per cent. There are now in Serbia 144 women to 100 men.

"In the districts occupied by Bulgaria, the reduction in population is 500,000. "Dr. Otakar Ribar, the Austrian reichsrath deputy, declared in the Vienna parliament on June 26: 'Serbia will be saved, but there will no longer be Serbs.' He said these words when protesting against the greatest crime committed in this war, the deportation of 20,000 Serbian women, children and men from the departments of Vranje, Nish and Pirot, and their internment in Asia Minor. Among these 20,000 there were 8,000 women and young girls, delivered over to the Turks. Of these a great number committed suicide by throwing themselves out of trains conveying them to Asia Minor.

"The deaths among war prisoners and those interned are put at from 60,000, to 80,000. After the retreat from Serbia and the reconstruction of the Serbian army, about 20 per cent died at Corfu. Our losses on the Salonika front have been about 50 per cent of the Serbian forces which have taken part in the operations of General Serrail's armies.

"Sixty thousand Serbian families in Serbia require succor this winter. They have no means of living except the little we can send to them. Their sufferings during the approaching winter will be very severe.

UNCLAIMED MINE FIELDS REPORTED AFLOAT

CHRISTIANIA, Oct. 18.—Drifting mine fields are reported along the whole Norwegian coast from Listerland eastwards. Off Hallo twenty mines were seen drifting north to Christiania Fjord, and from Halvo many explosions have been heard. The drifting mine fields are surrounded by a mass of drifting wreckage. Norwegian motor boats have salvaged many casks of wine, margarine and whale oil. Other boats report encountering "great masses of glass balls rolled up in steel wire and rope work, which seemed to be a type of U boat net."

The ownership of the drifting mine fields is a matter of doubt in the minds of some. Certainly nobody is anxious to claim them, for they do not conform to the rules of The Hague convention, which prescribes that mines shall be so constructed that they become harmless when adrift.
