## Coming Land Show To Educate Oregonians

PORTLAND, Oct. 19.—Heading up the various efforts for greater production from the soil and conservation of food supplies, the Manufacturers and Land Products Show will be opened at the new Auditorium, Portland, November 3d. The big show will be open to the public for nineteen days, and will represent the best in soil culture and industrial development in the Northwest. Every county in Oregon and Southwestern Washington will be represented in the complete exposition.

The primary purpose of the exposition is to introduce more fully to the men and women of the Northwest—the ultimate consumers—the products of the farms, the orchards and the dairies of Oregon, and the industrial plants, shops and factories of the state. The presentation is to be made in a manner that will appeal to every citizen. Being educational in its purpose, the show will aim to teach the consumers of the Northwest that home industry stands for all that is conducive to the development of latent resources, both human and material.

The show will be held at the new municipal Auditorium, constructed at a cost of \$600,000, giving every facility for making displays attractive and for handling large crowds. Two floors will be occupied by the show. The industrial displays and the soil products will be on the main floor,

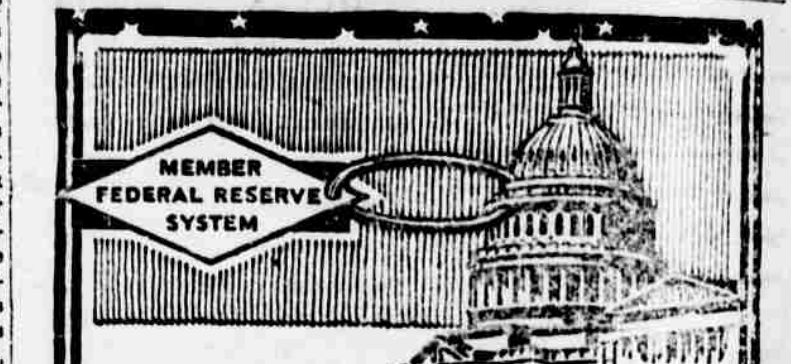
