WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 23.—The day of thrilling air duels between individual aviators seems to be passing. Both official and unofficial advice from Europe recently have shown increasing use of heavier machines, with greater armament.

There are indications that amendments already have been necessary for creating the huge air fleets provided for by congress. While there will be no lack of small fighting planes, it is probable that stress is being laid now on the bombing craft, and upon increasing the speed of these heavier machines and giving them adequate armament.

Bulgaria Tries Out Quiet Peace Feelers

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 23.—While Emperor William and King Ferdinand of Bulgaria have been exchanging assurances at Sofia of the unshakable loyalty of Bulgaria and Germany to each other, and of the permanent nature of the alliance of the two countries, Bulgarian agents abroad have been endeavoring to get into touch with the entente powers on the subject of peace and subsequent relations. Their efforts are declared to be inspired by apprehension that Germany and Austria-Hungary, particularly the latter, may not be over-sentinel in defending Bulgaria's interest at the peace conference, as well as by a desire on Bulgaria's part to escape

British Fleet Bombards Ostend

Associated Press Summary
British naval craft have heavily bombarded the port of Ostend, Belgium, which is being used by the Germans as a submarine base. The British official communication says numerous houses in the town were damaged by the shells from the naval guns.

On the fighting front in Belgium heavy artillery activity on the part of the British and French continues, with the Germans answering spiritedly on various sectors. In Champagne near Mont Cornillet and in the Verdun sector at several points there also have been violent artillery duels. In Champagne the Germans delivered somewhat heavy infantry attacks against the French west of Mont Cornillet, but were repulsed. There has been brisk fighting between the Ital-

ians and Austrians in the Trenton region and along the Julian front on the Austro-Italian theater, and between the entente forces and Teutonic allies in Macedonia.

The preliminary parliament has opened in Petrograd. Premier Kerensky made the opening speech and was loudly applauded when he announced that while Russia desired peace, she never would bow her head to force.
