Mrs. A. R. Canfield has been elected mayor of Warren, Ill., a town of between 1,000 and 2,000 persons.

Warren is in Jo Daviess County in the northern tier of Illinois. The county was settled between 1840 and 1850,

and contains a very intelligent agricultural population. Warren is a short distance from Galena, the old home of General Grant.

American Defense Body Outlines War Program

NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—A platform of eight planks, designed as a constructive program for the prosecution of the war to a definite victory, has been adopted by the American Defense Society, it has been announced, and will be submitted for discussion and approval to the chambers of commerce throughout the country and to the Chamber of Commerce of the United States at Washington. The purpose of the committee of the American Defense Society, which drew up the program, is announced to be to solidify the nation in the prosecution of the war. The proposals advocated by the society in its war platform are:

That the administration at Washington be urged to send an overwhelming force to France.

To intern alien enemies and enemy sympathizers whose conduct imperils or impedes the war.

To warn Germany that departures by her from the rules of war will not be endured.

To forbid the publication of newspapers and magazines in the German language during the war.

That congress be asked at its next session to declare that a state of war exists with Austria, Bulgaria and Turkey; to expel any disloyal members, and to enact a law prohibiting the issuance of new securities except by federal license.

It is recommended to "various authorities" that they forbid compulsory study of German in the public schools.

PROMINENT ENGLISH PHYSICIAN TO WED

LONDON, Nov. 2.—Although over 76 years old, Sir Douglas Powell, who was "physician in ordinary" to Queen Victoria, King Edward and King George, has just announced his engagement to Miss Edith Wood of London, and the marriage will take place this month. Sir Douglas has for fifty years been regarded as one of the greatest British authorities on tuberculosis.
