California Roads Will Open Isolated Districts

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21.—The opening up of Eureka and other coast points to important inland points in Northern and Central California and Oregon thru roads and trails in the isolated Trinity and Klamath National forests is now being effected by the National Forestry service, in co-operation with the State Highway commission. The Salmon River road, which will take ten years to complete, will be the principal artery between these

points. The government is contributing \$75,000 and Siskiyou County \$10,000 a year for this project. This road will open up a badly isolated region.

A twenty-six mile road is also being constructed down the south fork of the Trinity River in the Trinity National forest, which will also open up an isolated region to settlement. This road will eventually become a lateral of the main trunk highway between Red Bluff and Eureka.

SANTA CLAUSE'S STEEDS MAY BE SLAUGHTERED

SEATTLE, Nov. 21.—Residents of Nome, Alaska, are planning to ship reindeer meat to the "outside" in large quantities next year as food, according to S. J. Bakke, former mayor of Nome, who arrived here recently. It is said there are over 12,000 head of reindeer herded by Eskimos, in the vicinity of Nome.

One Nome company shipped a car and a half of reindeer meat to Seattle this month. One car will be sent east and the rest will be sold in Seattle.

JACKSON SHERIFF TO HANDLE BOOTLEGGERS

MELFORD, Nov. 21.—It was learned at the last session of the county court that the services of R. C. Porter of Ashland, who had been employed for several months in breaking up bootlegging between California towns across the state line and towns in this county, have been dispensed with. The situation is to be handled by the sheriff's office instead, it was announced.

NO COAL FAMINE IN BAY CITIES

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21.—All fears of a coal famine in California have been set at rest by an announcement of the war service board that 1,700 carloads are to be brought to this city from the Utah and Wyoming fields, together with big shipments from Seattle and British Columbia. The war service board figures that there is enough coal in sight to last the state more than 100 days.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 21.—A roundup of suspected Germans, mainly in the sea coast cities, is progressing under the president's proclamation made yesterday.

CANYONVILLE, Ore., Nov. 21.—Ed Laugh, proprietor of the hotel at Tiller, was arrested at Riddle by Deputy Sheriff Hopkins, charged with driving his automobile while intoxicated.

Laugh was fined \$50 by the justice of the peace who found him guilty as charged, and the offender was obliged to hire a man to drive his car home to Tiller, about thirty miles.

Secretary Baker Is Very Optimistic

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 21.—Hardening of the Italian defenses and the precision with which British and French reinforcements are being delivered in the Italian war theater leads Secretary Baker in his weekly war review to contemplate the future in that field with confidence. He points out, however, that the full strength of the Austro-German effort has not yet been developed.

The only reference to the sector of the western front, where American troops occupy first line trenches is that the men have shown themselves worthy of the best traditions of the American army.

"The training of our national army is now progressing rapidly," the statement says. "At all the camps the morale of our new citizen soldiers is reported excellent."

"The British and French officers who

are to assist in instructing our new armies are arriving.

"In France the training of our troops is likewise being carefully continued. In the sector where our forces are in the trenches they have shown themselves worthy of the best traditions of our armies."

"After the successes gained by the allies in the west during the preceding week, the relative calm of the last seven-day period was to be anticipated.

"It is significant, however, that the reaction of the enemy has been relatively slight both in the region north of the Aisne and in Flanders.

"At this season of the year the fog-bound fields of Flanders and the bad weather makes it difficult to coordinate major operations with precision. Nevertheless artillery preparations are continuing, presaging further offensive engagements."

RED CROSS CALL REACHES ESKIMOS

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Nov. 21.—Eskimos in far northern remote Alaskan villages, almost completely cut off from the outside world, will soon hear the call of the Red Cross, according to reports reaching here. Miss Mary Westdahl, a native school teacher of Elin, a village between Nome and St. Michael, has taken up the task of leading the Red Cross drive among the natives in her district, and hopes to add hundreds of Eskimo children and their parents to the list of contributors to the relief organization.

SHIPMASTER UP FOR BOOTLEGGING

ASTORIA, Nov. 21.—One of the first cases on the docket of the Circuit Court, which will convene again November 26th, will be that of the State of Oregon against Captain Carver, master of the steamer Kilburn, on appeal from the justice court, where the skipper was found guilty and fined for illegal possession of intoxicating liquor. The steamer was raided by the sheriff and a large amount of liquor secured. Seven members of the steamer's crew also were fined and took appeal.
