GERMAN SUBJECTS SAVINGS ARE SAFE

POSTAL SAVINGS OF GERMAN CITIZENS OR SUBJECTS WILL NOT BE DISTURBED DECLARES GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL

Some misapprehension seems to exist relative to the status under the trading-with-the-enemy act, of citizens or subjects of Germany or its allies resident in this country.

Such persons are not included within the term "enemy or ally of enemy" as employed in the act. Deposits in the postal savings banks of the United States belonging to such persons are not liable to seizure by the government, and will not, therefore, be taken into the possession of the alien property custodian or be interfered with in any way whatever. (Official Bulletin, Washington, D. C., October 30, 1917.)

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 22.—Representatives of the California, Oregon and Washington unions of electrical workers, and the president's mediation commission have met here for the first time.

THOUSANDS KILLED**IN MOSCOW RIOTS**

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 22.—The Swedish press says that General Kaledines with an army of Cossacks is moving against Moscow, where 8,000 have been killed in riots. There is no authoritative confirmation to this rumor.

SELF-SUPPORTING CO-EDS**ORGANIZE AT U. OF O.**

EUGENE, Nov. 22.—At a meeting of self-supporting women students at the University of Oregon here, it was divulged that one girl was able to attend college this year because she raised onion sets during the summer. Another co-ed donned overalls, and went forth to build fences, milk cows, and engage in other rural pastimes of that sort, in order to continue her education.

The self-supporting girls plan to organize a club under an appropriate name and meet regularly. About twenty are expected to enroll.

DRAFT EVASION**BECOMES DIFFICULT**

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 22.—A boarding officer for draft evaders is the latest government position to be created here. The officer is Gus Anderson, captain of the customs tug Hartley, and his duty is to board every incoming and outgoing vessel and make sure there are no draft evaders among the passengers and crew.

Anderson has a wide reputation on the water front, and was selected because of his long experience in examining seamen who desire certificates of ability.

RUSSIAN SUGAR SEIZED

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—Ten thousand tons of sugar purchased for the Imperial Russian government before the revolution and stored here, has been seized by the federal administration, and will be placed on the market.

Good Airplane Lumber Is Hard to Obtain

EUGENE, Nov. 22.—Out of approximately 240 cars of fir timber cut at a mill at Springfield, near here, only one car complied with specifications for aircraft construction, according to a lumberman interested in filling government orders. This illustrates the difficulty in securing suitable lumber for airplanes.

The government is taking all available airplane stock, it is declared. The lumber must be clear and straight grained. Inspectors pass upon every

piece of lumber accepted by the government.

Practically all the airplane stock produced by Lane County mills has been fir, the spruce is being used chiefly in the making of battle planes. Fir lumber serves for machines to be used only at training grounds, but cannot be used where there is danger of sun fire. Shrapnel will shatter fir, while it will only chip spruce, under similar circumstances. Spruce also is desirable because it is lighter and softer wood, lumbermen declare.

OFFICERS TRAINING**LIFE SOON OVER**

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 22.—Two days more, and the Presidio officers training camp will be over. The men are ready for a lively wind-up of their three months' training. Twenty-four hours more in the trenches is in store for the infantrymen, and while the program for the artillerymen provides

for no more work, the officers in command have given assurances that they will be able to find a few little things to fill in the time.
