## Justice Moves Slow But Sure In North

DAWSON, Y. T., Dec. 5.—A journey of 1,800 miles, which will take all winter to complete, has been undertaken by Corporal Conway of the Royal Mounted Police, in order that an Eskimo, accused of killing his wife, may be brought to justice. Corporal Conway started from Herschel Island, according to Bishop F. O. Stringer, who brought the news of the slaying here, and went first to Cape Bathurst, which is 400 miles from the island. He hoped to make the additional 400 miles to Coronation Gulf, the scene of the slaying before the winter becomes too severe. He expects to bring one witness as well as the accused man back to Herschel. The principals in the crime are said to belong to the blond Eskimo tribe.

## BAD FIRE IN NEW YORK CITY

GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS AFFECTED IN BLAZE WHICH DESTROYED HUGE BUILDINGS ON BROOKLYN WATER FRONT.

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—A devastating fire here has destroyed several acres of buildings on the Brooklyn water front, with a loss of over half a million. The fire affects a number of large government contracts. Authorities are trying to determine whether enemy plotters are responsible for the loss.
