### ALASKA WINTER ROAD OPEN

DAWSON, Y. T., Dec. 17.—Dawson's winter outlet to the "outside," the "Dawson Trail," as the wagon road to White Horse is known, is now open its full length, as the Yukon River recently froze sufficiently at Yukon crossing to permit the sleds and wagons to cross. The road is nearly 30 miles long, and crosses the river at but one place. As there are no bridges over the Yukon, the road cannot be used its full length until the ice hardens. Horses and automobiles are used on the Dawson White Horse road. Dogs have not pulled stages along the food for twenty years.

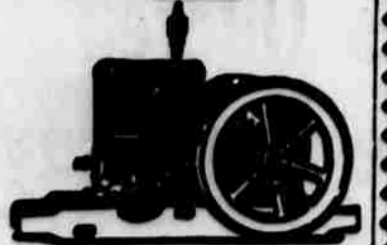
