HALL CAINE'S NOVEL WONDERFULLY PICTURIZED

Never before the filming of "The Manx-Man," the photodrama founded on Hall Caine's book of the same name, which will be produced at the opera house Saturday and Sunday, December 22 and 23, have the inhabitants of the locality where a picture was being taken shown such intense and lively interest in proceedings. The whole picture was taken on the Isle of Man, and because Hall Caine is the idol of the dwellers there



—or because they regard him as having done more for the island in his novels than any half dozen governors, they just naturally lent every possible collaboration, when they were apprised that he was interested in the work of the camera men and their directors. Even the English home office and the British board of admiralty co-operated, and permitted the camera to be used within three miles of the sea coast, such use being otherwise restricted during the period of the war.

The newspapers urged the people to make the film a success, and they all put themselves into the hands of George Loane Tucker, who directed the picture taking, unrestrictedly. When it became necessary to stage a representation of the famous Tynwald court ceremony, the men gathered on Tynwald Hill to the number of 1,000. Farmers came from the fields, fishermen from their boats, to appear in this stirring scene of "The Manx-Man." Every accessory to the ceremonial was provided by the governor's instructions, from the famous chair of state to the old sword of state that has been carried to Tynwald Hill for centuries.

And when the governor, Lord Ranelagh, was not quite satisfied with the costume worn by the actor playing the part of the governor in the film, he insisted on sending for his own uniform and giving it to the artist to wear. Could a producer hope for more authentic costume than that?

Public Urged To Hold Liberty Bonds

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 21.—The necessity for purchasers of Liberty bonds keeping them was impressed strongly upon about a hundred representatives of Liberty Loan committees from all parts of the country by Secretary McAdoo in a conference here. The conference was the first of a series that will be held for the purpose of co-ordinating the efforts of Liberty Loan workers in coming campaigns.

Lowered market prices for Liberty bonds, the secretary declared, were due to sales traceable to agents of

the Kaiser, thoughtless persons who do not realize that unnecessary sales drive down prices, and those who are forced by circumstances beyond their control to sell their bonds.

"Some persons sell these bonds for malevolent reasons," the secretary said. "Investigations that I have made recently convince me that the hand of the Kaiser is behind certain sales. Of course, I am not in possession of evidence which would convince a jury of the truth of this assertion, but I could convince any fair minded man of it. Thoughtless persons, who think they have done their

duty when they buy bonds, also sell them. These thoughtless persons can be changed to thoughtful ones if we will show them how their sales affect the government. We can not influence the Kaiser's people, but we can put them in the penitentiaries, and I want to see them there, for we must deal relentlessly with all enemies of America."

Discussion of plans for meeting the question that has arisen from the value of bonds being driven down by sales was urged by the secretary.

Touching on interest rates, the secretary said he hoped it would not be necessary to raise them above the present 4 per cent rate for succeeding loans. He also added that he hoped it would be unnecessary to raise by taxes during the remainder of this fiscal year more money than now is provided for by law, and that no marked changes be made in the present tax rates for the coming fiscal year. This, however, he said, was a matter for congressional determination, and he had no idea as to the congressional view on it.

Fearful Conditions In Northeast China

TOKIO, Dec. 2.—(Correspondence)—Reports reaching Tokio describe the situation existing in Harbin, Manchuria, as grave. During the past three months there have been 227 murders, mostly in connection with robberies, and crime of every description occurs daily.

Many of the ruffians are dressed in

the uniform of soldiers as a disguise, and yet the army looks upon the matter with indifference. Inhabitants of the city do not dare to go out of doors after sunset. As the police are not equal to their task, and as the conditions are expected to grow worse with the increase of cold, foreign residents are planning to organize a private police from their own number. The Japanese consular authorities have protested to the Russian authorities, but with no effect.

NEW USE FOR SNUFF BOXES

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Snuff boxes are said to be coming back in fashion, but with the difference that they now contain sugar instead of snuff.

The sugar rationing in force is expected to make it necessary for visitors to carry around their own sugar and the old tightly fitting snuff boxes of silver, enamel and inlaid wood are being brought to light for this purpose. There is said to be also a demand for futuristic boxes with wadded effects painted on them.

JAPS PLAN LONG TUNNEL

TOKIO, Dec. 21.—The government railway board has decided to tunnel the Shimonoseki Straits, the western outlet of the Inland Sea, says an announcement. The tidal current thru the straits is unusually rapid, making navigation difficult, and at times impossible to all but the most powerful steamships. The length of the tunnel will be 6 1/2 miles. It will be operated by electricity, and will cost 15,000,000 yen.

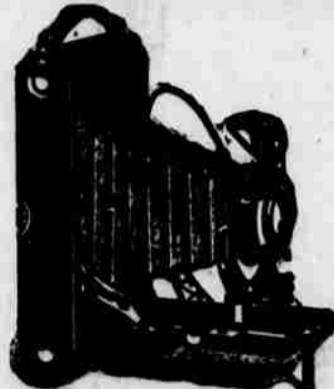

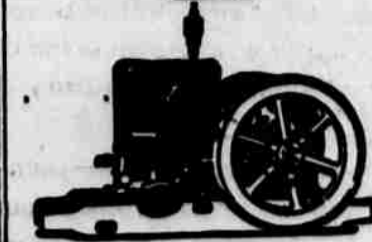
