

Liquid Linoleum Is Latest At Pendleton

PENDLETON, Dec. 31.—An instance of bootlegging camouflage was brought to light here when the police confiscated a piece of freight, apparently a roll of linoleum, en route in a delivery wagon from freight sheds to a warehouse. The linoleum splash, when moved, however, which caused an investigation.
