MUCH SMUGGLING

ACROSS SOUTH BORDER

EL PASO, Texas, January 1.—Petty smuggling has increased greatly, the authorities here say, since the food embargo was put into effect on all shipments to Mexico.

Mexican wagon drivers have been found with sacks of flour concealed in a false bottom of their wagons. Women have been discovered smuggling small articles of prohibited food in their waists, while every bale of hay and sack of grain is searched by soldiers at the bridge for contraband articles. The food embargo has proved a severe hardship upon the Mexicans in Juarez, who depended upon El Paso stores for their supplies.

Registration of Enemies to Begin

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 1.—The week of February 4 has been set aside by the department of justice for registration of the half million unnaturalized Germans in the country by police and postmasters, in pursuance of President Wilson's alien enemy proclamation, declaring this action as a means of minimizing the

danger from enemy sympathizers. Registration will involve the gathering of detailed information concerning the business, relatives and habits of every German, together with his photograph and finger prints. After registering he must carry a certificate card, and may not change his place of residence without approval of the

Latch-string of West is Out For Soldiers

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 1.—The latch-string of the West is out to the enlisted men and all others in the fighting forces of the United States. The territory from the Canadian line to the Southern border and from the Pacific Ocean to an undefined line a thousand or so miles in land, is one

big "open house" for the entertainment of the uniformed forces. At the head of the welcoming hosts is the war camp community service.

Perils of The Airmen Require Steel Nerves

SOMEWHERE IN FRANCE, the anti-aircraft barrage is today the most dreaded enemy weapon which the aviator has to face in his flights over the lines. In the midst of a sea of bursting shells, the airplane lobs up and down like a ship in a violent storm. The explosions which the shells make in bursting produce a swift succession of air-pockets and air bumps, and it is absolutely impossible to keep a machine steady thru them. Meanwhile there is the strain of knowing always that the next instant one of the thousands of flying shell splinters may reach a vital spot in either machine or pilot.

Yet it is not possible to avoid flying thru a barrage at times. The latest type of anti-aircraft guns can place a barrage as high as 23,000 feet, and it is not practical to turn about and try to climb over the barrage. It takes a very highly specialized scout machine to climb 23,000 feet, and the

lice or postmaster. Violation of the regulations will be punishable by imprisonment for the war.

This order does not apply to German women, nor to any persons under 14 years of age, because these are not classed as alien enemies by law. Subjects of Austria-Hungary are not required to register.

In announcing the regulations the department of justice took care to avoid the impression that the government looks on each German with suspicion.

"Registrants are not to be treated as persons of evil disposition," said instructions to registrars, "and the registration officers are urged to deal with them in a courteous and friendly manner."

Certificate cards will be issued only after a complete verification is made. In cities of 5,000 or more population recorded by the 1910 census, the chief of police and his assistants will administer the registration. In smaller communities and rural districts registration will be conducted by the postmaster, and the postmaster of the largest offices in the local judicial district, in most states the equivalent of a county, will be the chief registration officer, to gather the reports from the others and forward them to the United States marshal and the department of justice. In most cities the work will be done by precincts.
