

Food Rations Prove Success In England

LONDON, Feb. 6.—Rationing of bread and flour. The best report on food, meat and sugar has been an unqualified success in British hotels and restaurants, according to a report from the ministry of food. The reports received from the proprietors show that some hotels have used only half of their allowance of meat, while numerous eating places have been 30 to 35 per cent under their ration of bread and flour. The best report on sugar showed a total amount used of only two-thirds of the official allowance.

Under the present regulations hotels and restaurants are allowed to use two ounces of meat for breakfast and five ounces for lunch and dinner. The other allowances are eight ounces of bread, two ounces of flour and one ounce of sugar daily.

Nearly 3,000,000 Huns Now On West Front

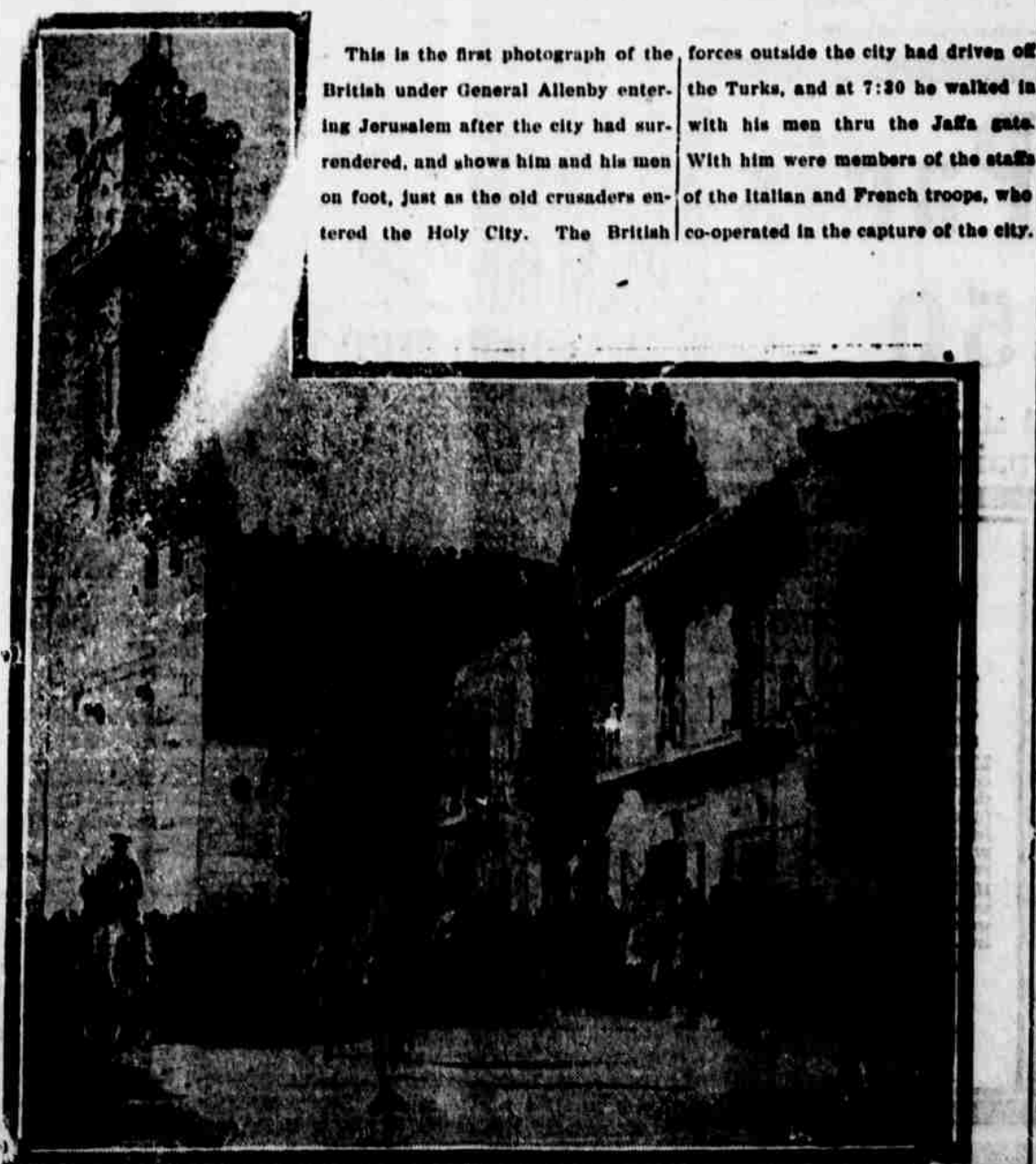
WITH THE FRENCH ARMIES IN THE FIELD, Feb. 6.—The Germans to date have concentrated between 180 and 190 divisions—2,700,000 to 2,850,000 men—on the western front in preparation for their expected spring offensive. Since the allies' offensive last April the maximum of the German concentration on the western front consisted of 155 divisions, until the Russian armistice permitted the increase to the present strength. Already 115 divisions are on the lines, while the remaining 65 to 75 are held in reserve, presumably for the purpose of rushing into a surprise attack or checking the allies should the Germans leave to them the initiative of the spring offensive. The Germans still have 60 divisions on the Russian front, consisting of worn-out, decimated units, from which the best soldiers have been transferred to the western theater.

Wave of Crime Is Sweeping Chicago

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—Chicago's entire law-enforcing machinery is now in operation in a determined campaign to stamp out crime and clear the city of criminals. More than forty men, many of them declared to be notorious law breakers and leaders of bandit gangs, already are in custody. Harry Emerson and Benjamin Daniels are among those in custody, and are said to have been identified as two of the four men who robbed the Illinois Central railroad station of \$1,800 and killed Deonla Tierney, a collector, last Friday.

The British Conquerors Entering Jerusalem on Foot Like Crusaders

This is the first photograph of the British under General Allenby entering Jerusalem after the city had surrendered, and shows him and his men on foot, just as the old crusaders entered the Holy City. The British forces outside the city had driven off the Turks, and at 7:30 he walked in with his men thru the Jaffa gate. With him were members of the staff of the Italian and French troops, who co-operated in the capture of the city.



German Morale Is Weaker, Says British Major



Major Hugh W. Niven, who has fought the Germans for three years, said on his arrival in the United States the other day that for a year and a half or two years the Germans had fought with desperation. "But," said he, "during the past year I have not seen a single German officer or soldier who did not promptly throw up his hands and yell 'Kamerad' when my men were within fifteen feet of him."
