

German Press Ridicules Admiral Von Tirpitz

AMSTERDAM, Feb. 19.—Following is a report in the German socialist paper Vorwarts of a speech by Admiral von Tirpitz at a meeting of the Fatherland Party in Essen:

"In Essen, von Tirpitz told his hearers that no one in Germany, from the highest to the lowest, had incited, or wanted this war."

"In Essen, von Tirpitz railed at British munitionism and capitalism. 'Germany flourished only by honest labor,' he said."

"In Essen, von Tirpitz pleaded for public spirit and unselfishness."

"In Essen, von Tirpitz thundered against the trust magnates of America and England."

"In Essen, are the Krupp works."

Huns May Make Drive In Italy

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 19.—Germany intends a major offensive against the Balkans and Italy is a growing view in entente military quarters here.

The net result of the prolonged troop movements of the Teuton on the west front was said by reliable sources to be merely the replacement of tired, short divisions by full, fresh divisions, with an appreciable numerical strengthening at one point only.

Germany's constant advertising of her moves and her plans for a big west front offensive have made military men skeptical of her real purposes. She has never before let the world into her "confidence" as to plans, so the thought that many troops taken from the west and east lines have been shunted for a Balkan-Italian drive gets fresh strength.

Moreover, advertisement of a west front offensive would have the effect of making the allies align for a defensive there. While the Italian-Balkan drive is talked there is also belief that the Germans may plan to smash thru Switzerland. American military advisers throw no light on either problem.

Military men are not discussing

their apprehension over an Italian or Balkan drive. While it is admitted that the allies in Italy are better prepared to stem the Teuton offensive than they were at the close of hostilities last winter, it is also conceded that the Austro-German armies in the Asiago and Upper Piave sectors are in better shape to continue their advance. Winter alone was primarily responsible for the cessation of von Mackenz's smashing progress.

The Italian situation is critical.

Germany's first and greatest effort will be to take Venice. Once Venice falls, the Teuton problem is virtually solved. Troops and supplies in unlimited numbers and amounts can be transported across the Adriatic from Trieste and Pola thru a lane protected by mines and submarines, thereby eliminating the uncertain and arduous task of maintaining a line of communication thru the mountains.

That the allies have taken into consideration the importance of blocking this possibility is evidenced by the contemplated Adriatic naval campaign. Admiral Sims and entente naval men are believed to have decided upon some joint action at their recent meeting.

Wheat Is Fed To Cattle In South

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 19.—While the world starves for wheat, Western farmers are feeding it to their cattle.

John A. Simpson, president of the Farmers' Union of Oklahoma, made this startling statement to the senate agriculture committee.

He declared that with the price paid for wheat by the government, it was more profitable for farmers to feed livestock wheat than to sell the wheat and go into the market and buy other foodstuffs for cattle.

Unless the price of wheat is raised, Simpson said, there will be a loss of 1,000,000 bushels in Oklahoma alone.

Farmers will not plant at the present price, he testified.

"They aren't going to do it unless they see pay," he said.

Simpson argued for a government price on wheat at \$3 a bushel to "play safe," and said \$4 wheat would insure a fair profit to the farmer.
