To the Editor: Sherman once said that 'War is hell.' I wonder what he would call Klamath's court house fight. It seems that we are in for another bitter factional struggle in order to locate our temple of justice. What the county at one time wanted was a court house, and that it be built with economy. What it got was a dose of strife and faction, greed and vanity, that split the county wide open. Having spent enough to build two—or more—court houses, the issue is still up, and seemingly as far from settled as ever. To those who have always taken the most active part in its location at either site, the enhancement of real estate values has always been the guiding motive. The county knows it, everybody is aware of it, and yet the tail still wags the dog. As to completing the present court house, the court will be damned if they do, and damned if they don't. I believe that the only way to settle the matter satisfactorily to the COUNTY is to place before the people definite propositions as to completing the present building or building a new one, and then let this settle the matter, and hang the first man who mentions court house site again. But the present time is not one in which to build a court house. The citizen is asked by the administration to defer until after the war the building of a private house. If we must get along with our present homes, we can manage to wait with the court house until after the Hun is conquered. Building now costs from one-third to one-half more than during normal times, and on an expenditure of \$150,000 we can save enough to pay us to wait. Labor is scarce, and skilled carpenters are needed to build ships.
