A shadow of sorrow was thrown over the Merrill community by the announcement of the death of Louis Tolle at the Mare Island naval station last Friday. There are perhaps many boys as good and true as was the deceased, but it would be hard to convince any one who knew him that there were any better. His short life was spent in devotion to duty, parents, friends and good deeds. After finishing the grade school work here he entered the Klamath County high school, and graduated from that institution. He took a prominent part in all student activities, and was a strong member of the debating team. After completing the course he had a strong desire to study for the ministry, but delayed it for a time to aid his father in operating his farm. Together they built up one of the best dairy herds in Klamath County. When the call to service came, although his paternal ancestry is pure German, he was at once ready to enlist with the forces of Democracy. He remarked to the writer that he wanted to serve where he was most useful, either in agriculture or at the front. In November he volunteered and was assigned to the navy. Not only we remember him as a capable soldier and sailor, but also as a leader of the crew. At an early age he identified himself with the church, and faithfully served his mother. While yet a boy he became superintendent of the Presbyterian Sunday school, and every Sunday thereafter he drove three miles, regardless of weather and distance, to serve at his post. He leaves a father and mother, Mrs. H. F. Tolle, three sisters, Audrey, Gertrude and Mae, and a host of sorrowing friends.
