Big Red Cross Drive Set for May Twentieth

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 13.—The war council of the American Red Cross has announced that the campaign to raise the second war loan relief fund of \$100,000,000 would be postponed until the week of May 20. It was the original intention to begin raising this money for Red Cross work on May 6th, but fear that it might detract even slightly from the forthcoming Liberty Loan Campaign prompted the War Council to postpone the date for two weeks. This action, therefore, fixes the date of the Second War Fund Campaign 11 months after the first which was carried on during the week of June 18, 1917. The War Council had been appointed by President Wilson five weeks prior to the start of this first money raising campaign, and its first great task was to provide means for carrying on the relief work on a scale commensurate with the military operations. More than \$100,000,000

was contributed in response to the first call for financial aid, and these contributions plus interest brought the total receipts from the first drive to \$105,990,257. Of this amount \$17,006,121 was refunded to chapters for local relief work, and of the balance \$77,721,918 has been appropriated, leaving a balance available for appropriations of \$10,371,217. France has been the beneficiary of American Red Cross appropriations in the sum of more than \$30,000,000. During the week preceding Christmas the Red Cross conducted a membership drive which resulted in the enrollment of approximately 22,000,000 new members, and this was followed last month by a campaign conducted by the Junior Membership of the Red Cross which resulted in the enrollment in that collateral organization of virtually all the school children in America.

HUNS FOUND CHAINED TO MACHINE GUNS

GERMAN SOLDIER WITH A RED CROSS INSIGNIA ON COAT IS CAPTURED WITH SAW TOOTH BAYONET, ATROCITIES TERRIBLE.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 13.—A saw-toothed bayonet taken from a German soldier who wore the Red Cross insignia upon his arm was one of the several mementoes exhibited by Lieutenant J. L. Carter, of the Canadian Expeditionary forces when he told of German atrocities committed in France at a big war rally recently held here. Lieutenant Carter, spent two years and seven months in the front line trenches at Ypres and the Somme. "You should believe all you hear about terrible and unbelievable German atrocities" said the Canadian army officer. "I have seen so many samples of hideous atrocities by the Huns that I know that the worst imaginable stories about them can be true."

REALIZING THAT MARRIAGE IS A LOTTERY ANYWAY, DUTCH GIRLS WED AT LONG DISTANCE WITH MEN THEY HAVE NEVER KNOWN.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 13.—A dozen blushing brides are held in detention by the government authorities here as the result of the orders of the war trade board holding the Dutch steamer Orange at this port. All were married by proxy in Holland and each bears the name of the husband whom she has never seen. It was explained that a Dutch youth going to Sumatra or Java is expected to remain there five or six years and, if at any time before this term expires he has accumulated sufficient money to be married, he telegraphs his proposal to the fair one, whose family selects one of his kin or even a good friend to act in the bridegroom's place. The proxy and the bride appear before an official and she is then legally married according to the Dutch law.
