Railroads Ordered To Take Inventory

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 16.—Railroads have been ordered by Director General McArdoo to make an inventory of materials and supplies on hand December 31, 1917, when private control ceased, for use in connection with government administration of purchasing additions and betterments and railroad financing. The inventories must be begun by May 1, according to the order, and are to be adjusted to show conditions on December 31. If inventories have been taken since that date or within ninety days before then, they may be used as the basis for the report. The inventories will be valuable to the government and the railroads when the period of control ends, as the government is required to return the railroads' properties in as good condition as when they were taken over.

Former War Prices Exceed Those of Today

DETROIT, Mich., March 16.—The housewives who have protested against the prices they pay for food these days, may realize some consolation from the fact that their grandmothers and the grandmothers' mothers also did that same thing or more than one occasion. Two dollar wheat in Michigan is not by any means a 20th century innovation. Neither is fifteen dollar flour, nor is two dollar corn. A hundred years ago some food stuffs cost more in Detroit than they do now; fifty years ago prices also were meteoric—in fact every generation since the dawn of the nineteenth century, has felt the pinch of high prices. Armenians in Great Danger of Massacre

BOSTON, March 16.—More than 3,000,000 Christian Armenians, Georgians and others, among whom are seventeen American missionaries, are in imminent peril of being massacred by the Turks and Tartars in north-eastern Turkey and Trans-Caucasia. This information was contained in a private cable to the American board of missions here and was announced thru the Congressionalist.

The advices, which came from agents of the board now in the line of the Teuton drive in the east, said the Turks and Tartars under German direction are being incited to wipe out the Christians.

"The details of the Teuton plans would strike terror to the civilized world," according to the report.

An international authority, whose name, for diplomatic reasons, can not be given, said Germany would welcome a declaration of war on Turkey by the United States.

It was pointed out that despite beliefs to the contrary, the majority of the Turks are not friendly to Ger-

GREY WOLVES TROUBLE FARMERS NEAR EUGENE

EUGENE, Ore., March 15.—The pelts of five big grey wolves, poisoned by John L. Vaughn of Fall Creek, near his home were brought to the city recently. There have been several bands of the wolves in the mountains east of Eugene during the winter and farmers' stock suffered at different times. Many attempts were made to trap the wolves without success, and efforts to poison them also failed. Vaughn used a poison mixture of his own devising and found the five dead wolves a few days later.
