BANDITS HOLD UP BIG BANK IN BAY CITY

FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS SECURED AND ROBBERS ESCAPE AFTER LOCKING UP EMPLOYEES

SAN FRANCISCO, March 21.—Three bandits, masked and armed, held up the Yokahama Specie bank, limited, here, and escaped with approximately \$5,000, after locking up more than twenty of the institution's employees in an office room.

The men drove to a side entrance of the bank in an automobile. They adjusted their masks as they entered the building, forcing the employees, both men and women, to enter the office room at the points of pistols. After securing approximately \$5,000 in coin and currency, the men fled, leaving their automobile behind them. Detectives and patrolmen have taken up the pursuit in automobiles.

be seen an exact duplicate of the flag that inspired Francis Scott Key to write the national anthem, "The Star Spangled Banner." This was the flag that floated over Fort Henry at Baltimore when the British flag attacked the American fort. At that time the national emblem consisted of fifteen stripes and fifteen stars, and measured 40x30 feet. The duplicate of this flag, screened in "The Slacker," measures exactly the same as the original, which is one of the treasures of the United States government. Under cover of a flag of truce the young composer had gone on board a British vessel to see a friend who was a prisoner, and during the night the British attacked the fortress. The sight of Old Glory, battle-scarred, but still flying in the morning breeze, inspired him to write the immortal song.
